WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 25, 1941 decreased 1,626,934 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 170,549,227 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 471,901,534 bushels compared with 473,528,468 bushels for the previous week and 301,352,307 bushels for the week of April 26, 1940. The stocks of 471,901,534 bushels include 5,476,726 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending April 25, 1941 were 438,116,834 bushels compared with 436,504,960 bushels for the previous week and 284,318,954 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 242,610,000; Interior Terminals 26,013,320; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,102,249; Victoria 991,919; Prince Rupert 1,208,058; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 79,141,762; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 9,923,559 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,608,265 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,700,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 57,305; Victoria 1,929; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 4,001,521 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 2,235,434 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 242,222; Prince Rupert 87, and Fort William and Port Arthur 5,666,300 bushels.

For the week ending April 25, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 7,552,741 bushels, and in transit by rail 27,347,565, compared with 9,360,297 in transit on the lakes and 25,720,602 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,784,700 bushels, a decrease of 3,238,808 bushels from the previous week when 37,023,508 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 16,055,151; Erie 326,000; Buffalo 2,736,000; Buffalo Afloat 291,000; Albany 6,678,000; New York 1,425,000; New York Afloat 208,000; Boston 742,881; Philadelphia 1,155,549; Baltimore 2,619,350 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,547,769 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 269,000; Buffalo Afloat 26,000; Ogdensburg 158,000; Albany 288,000; New York 109,000; New York Afloat 342,000; Boston 731,120; Portland 445,971; Philadelphia 174,073 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,051,035 bushels, while increases were noted at Duluth of 4,113; Erie 139,000 and Baltimore 212,278 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,035,353 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 385,000; Buffalo 2,872,000; Albany 5,453,000; New York 402,000; Boston 392,911; Portland 623,774; Philadelphia 1,466,301; Baltimore 1,745,490 and in Transit U.S.A. 963,000 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 25, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 5,906,372 bushels. This compared with 3,189,016 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to April 25, 1941 was 106,085,740 bushels compared with 112,108,289 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 25, 1941 amounted to 7,643,140 bushels, an increase of 3,153,342 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 4,489,798 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,320,245 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 25, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 850,463 (152,623); Saskatchewan 3,993,793 (791,001); Alberta 2,798,884 (374,141) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirty-eight weeks from August 1, 1940 to April 25, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 46,304,659 (51,017,804); Saskatchewan 186,786,900 (215,100,506); Alberta 125,476,239 (119,985,382) bushels. For the thirty-eight weeks ending April 25, 1941 and the same period in 1940, 358,567,798 and 386,106,172 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending April 26, 1941 amounted to 9,648,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,657,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,593,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,549,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 540,000 bushels. Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to April 26, 1941 amounted to 207,651,000 bushels as compared with 382,960,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments were 142,332,000 bushels as compared with 158,744,000 bushels for the same period in 1939-40.
