WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 30, 1940 increased 10,995,220 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 160,869,929 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 303,869,756 bushels compared with 292,874,536 bushels for the previous week and 142,999,827 bushels for the week of September 1, 1939. The stocks of 303,869,756 bushels include 8,259,028 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 30, 1940 were 272,360,464 bushels c mpared with 261,662,168 bushels for the previous week and 135,792,827 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 70,210,000; Interior Terminals 22,950,736; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,590,505; Victoria 713,480; Prince Rupert 1,136,049; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,401,514; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 41,540,755 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,689,389 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 8,330,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 209,925; Victoria 29,141 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 708,338 bushels, while decreases were noted at Interior Terminals of 4,599; Fort William and Port Arthur 413,502 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 649,084 bushels.

For the week onding August 30, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,036,699 bushels and in transit by rail 14,596,757 compared with 4,359,589 in transit on the lakes and 19,626,398 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,509,292 bushels, an increase of 296,924 bushels over the previous week when 31,212,368 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports; Duluth 2,508,731; Buffalo 6,918,000; Buffalo Afloat 233,000; Frie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 1,080,000; Chicago 36,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 1,558,000; New York Afloat 132,000; Albany 8,487,000; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Boston 2,231,099; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,671,203 bushels,

Increases were shown at Duluth of 268,572; Buffalo 110,000; Erie Canal 811,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 316,000; Albany 440,000 and Boston 89,811 bushels, while decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 123,000; New York Afloat 474,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,525,774 bushels.


For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 7,207,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 1,190,000; Buffalo Afloat 160,000; Erie 1,110,000; Erie Canal 25,000; New York 732,000 and Albany 3,710,000 bushels.

 During the week ending August 30, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,997,614 bushels. This compared with 1,538,471 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to August 30, 1940 was 7,530,564 bushels compared with 10,547,763 bushels a year ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 30, 1940 amounted to 14,860,572 bushels, an increase of 4,265,211 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 10,595,361 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 33,304,321 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 30 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 3,492,916 (11,291,828); Saskatchewan 9,000,303 (16,384,227); Alberta 2,367,353 (5,628,266) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the four weeks from August 1, 1940 to August 30, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 7,888,442 (25,308,392); Saskatchewan 17,914,463 (24,019,144); Alberta 6,541,321 (10,287,884) bushels. For the four weeks ending August 30, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 32,344,226 and 59,615,420 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending August 31, 1940 amounted to 5,470,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,024,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,636,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,305,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 987,000 bushels.

During the first four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 21,990,000 bushels as compared with 39,384,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 11,581,000 bushels as compared with 17,144,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 9,673,000 bushels during the first four weeks of the present crop year as compared with 13,240,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.5 million bushels as compared with 9.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 2.9 million bushels as compared with 4.3 million bushels in the same weeks last year.



EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 471,964 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 44,494; rye 158; corn 479,996 and soya beans 2,395 bushels, while oatsmand barley decreased 41,157 and 13,922 bushels respectively.
