WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 11, 1941 decreased 3,136,328 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 181,193,517 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 463,444,766 bushels compared with 466,581,094 bushels for the previous week and 282,251,249 bushels for the week of July 12, 1940. The stocks of 463,444,766 bushels include 2,388,659 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending July 11, 1941 were 426,694,938 bushels compared with 429,565,332 bushels for the previous week and 256,150,062 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 214,930,000; Interior Terminals 26,398,305; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,149,530; Victoria 994,478; Prince Rupert 1,207,975; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,415,357; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 34,103,962 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,666,502 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 4,815,000; Interior Terminals 32,594; Vancouver-New Westminster 153,962 and Victoria 2,667 bushels, while increases were noted at Fort William and Port Arthur of 89,228; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,575,457 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,288,377 bushels.

For the week ending July 11, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,911,483 bushels, and in transit by rail 23,299,950, compared with 3,356,347 in transit on the lakes and 23,704,805 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

Stocks of Ontario grain: According to the Eastern Elevators, the following quantities of Ontario wheat, oats, rye, buckwheat and corn are in the undermentioned ports. (in bushels)



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 36,749,828 bushels, a decrease of 265,934 bushels from the previous week when 37,015,762 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 13,039,101; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 400,000; Buffalo 5,280,000; Buffalo Afloat 361,981; Albany 2,770,000; New York 2,683,000 N.Y. Afloat 1,173,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 678,891 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,153,372 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 695,000; Buffalo 202,000; New York 433,000; and In Transit U.S.A. 116,311 bushels, while increases were at Erie Canal Afloat of 302,000; Buffalo Afloat 361,981; New York Afloat 503,000 and Baltimore 13,396 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,101,187 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 2,010,000; Erie Canal Afloat 289,000; Chicago Afloat 47,000; Buffalo 5,286,000; Buffalo Afloat 345,000; Albany 5,437,000; New York 823,000; New York Afloat 214,000; Boston 2,244,023; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,191,614; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,187,151 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending July 11, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,085,188 bushels. This compared with 2,012,384 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to July 11, 1941 was 165,270,730 bushels compared with 146,108,450 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 11, 1941 amounted to 3,032,270 bushels, a decrease of 1,914,436 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 4,946,706 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,101,967 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 11, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 465,768 (210,054); Saskatchewan 1,581,609 (2,393,257); Alberta 984,893 (1,498,656) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-nine weeks from August 1, 1940 to July 11, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 55,283,285 (52,850,944); Saskatchewan 231,503,023 (230,946,964); Alberta 149,993,471 (129,597,423) bushels. For the forty-nine weeks ending July 11, 1941 and the same period in 1940 436,779,779 and 413,395,331 bushels were received from the farms.



World shipments for the week ending July 12, 1941 amounted to 8,143,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,698,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,512,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 371,000 bushels. Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to July 12, 1941 amounted to 307,351,000 bushels as compared with 531,503,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year.
