WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 18, 1941 decreased 1,826,352 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 179,500,256 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 461,618,414 bushels compared with 463,444,766 bushels for the previous week and 282,118,158 bushels for the week of July 19, 1940. The stocks of 461,618,414 bushels include 2,100,230 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending July 18, 1941 were 428,828,782 bushels compared with 426,694,938 bushels for the previous week and 256,445,170 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 214,700,000; Interior Terminals 26,251,879; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,715,272; Victoria 994,478; Prince Rupert 1,207,975; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 78,583,380; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 36,406,758 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 24,345,100 bushels.

Increases were noted at Fort William and Port Arthur of 168,023; Eastern Elevators Lake ports 2,302,796 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard ports 678,598 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 230,000; Interior Terminals 146,426 and Vancouver-New Westminster 434,258 bushels.

For the week ending July 18, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 4,296,654 bushels, and in transit by rail 21,709,890, compared with 2,618,625 in transit on the lakes and 22,444,735 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,789,632 bushels, a decrease of 3,960,196 bushels from the previous week when 36,749,828 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 12,330,601; Erie 2,233,000; Buffalo 5,329,000; Buffalo Afloat 429,000; Albany 2,770,000; New York 2,989,000; New York Afloat 520,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 578,895 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,632,653.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 708,500; Erie Canal Afloat 400,000; New York Afloat 653,000; Baltimore 99,996 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,520,719 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 49,000; Buffalo Afloat 67,019 and New York 306,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,672,988 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 2,010,000; Erie Canal Afloat 576,000; Chicago Afloat 47,000; Buffalo 5,097,000; Buffalo Afloat 421,000; Albany 5,913,000; New York 823,000; New York Afloat 214,000; Boston 2,275,979; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,151,614; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,503,996 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending July 18, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,994,157 bushels. This compared with 2,428,512 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to July 18, 1941 was 168,264,887 bushels compared with 148,536,962 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 18, 1941 amounted to 7,117,301 bushels, an increase of 4,077,577 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 3,039,724 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,156,753 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 18, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 609,134 (236,544); Saskatchewan 3,828,631 (2,715,108); Alberta 2,679,536 (1,205,101) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty weeks from August 1, 1940 to July 18, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 55,899,641 (53,087,488); Saskatchewan 235,331,886 (233,662,072); Alberta 152,673,007 (130,802,524) bushels. For the fifty weeks ending July 18, 1941 and the same period in 1940 443,904,534 and 417,552,084 bushels were received from the farms.



EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 1,231,220 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in wheat of 49,499; barley 4; rye 190; corn 1,226,437 and soya beans 20,751 bushels, while oats increased 65,661 bushels.

Duluth: Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by lake for the week ending July 19, 1941 were nil. For the period August 1, 1940 to date rail receipts amounted to wheat 16,074,345, barley 119,692 and lake receipts of barley 388,483 bushels.

Lake Shipments of wheat for the week ending July 19 were 708,500 and rail shipments of barley 10,000 bushels. For the period August 1, 1940 to date, lake shipments amounted to wheat 6,456,225 bushels and rail shipments of wheat 15,690 and barley 251,897 bushels.
