WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 25, 1941 increased 715,015 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 180,974,007 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 462,333,429 bushels compared with 461,618,414 bushels for the previous week and 281,359,422 bushels for the week of July 26, 1940. The stocks of 462,333,429 bushels include 2,033,341 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending July 25, 1941 were 430,202,168 bushels compared with 428,828,782 bushels for the previous week and 256,136,572 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 214,440,000; Interior Terminals 26,150,896; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,539,692; Victoria 994,311; Prince Rupert 1,207,975; Churchill 2,617,393; Fort William and Port Arthur 79,048,779; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 39,563,624 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,457,754 bushels.

Increases were noted at Fort William and Port Arthur of 465,399 and Eastern Elevators Lake ports 3,156,866 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 260,000; Interior Terminals 100,983; Vancouver-New Westminster 175,580; Victoria 167 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 887,346 bushels.

For the week ending July 25, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 4,952,464 bushels, and in transit by rail 20,229,277 compared with 2,065,796 in transit on the lakes and 23,713,685 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,131,261 bushels, a decrease of 658,371 bushels from the previous week when 32,789,632 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 11,366,550; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 737,000; Buffalo 5,954,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,045,000; New York Afloat 487,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 685,743 and In Transit U.S.A. 819,485.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 964,051; Buffalo Afloat 429,000; New York Afloat 33,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 813,168 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 737,000; Buffalo 625,000; Albany 56,000; New York 56,000 and Baltimore 106,848 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,222,850 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,731,877; Erie 2,010,000; Erie Canal Afloat 360,000; Chicago 45,000; Buffalo 5,117,000; Albany 6,492,000; New York 559,000; New York Afloat 174,000; Boston 2,275,979; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,064,189; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,098,283 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending July 25, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,025,654 bushels. This compared with 3,202,665 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to July 25, 1941 was 171,290,541 bushels compared with 151,739,627 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 25, 1941 amounted to 7,202,830 bushels, an increase of 1,066,484 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 6,136,346 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,054,210 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 25, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 629,567 (258,721); Saskatchewan 3,844,201 (2,181,741); Alberta 2,729,062 (1,613,748) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-one weeks from August 1, 1940 to July 25, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 56,698,447 (53,346,209); Saskatchewan 238,212,182 (235,843,813); Alberta 155,215,780 (132,416,272) bushels. For the fifty-one weeks ending July 25, 1941 and the same period in 1940 450,126,409 and 421,606,294 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending July 26, 1941 amounted to 6,093,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,523,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,744,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 460,000 bushels. Cumulative world shipments for the period August 1, 1940 to July 26, 1941 amounted to 320,982,000 bushels as compared with 545,223,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year.


