

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 13, 1940 increased 15,254,318 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 109,865,517 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 331,818,349 bushels compared with 316,564,031 bushels for the previous week and 221,952,832 bushels for the week of September 15, 1939. The stocks of 331,818,349 bushels include 8,643,505 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 13, 1940 were 296,318,016 bushels compared with 283,388,592 bushels for the previous week and 213,676,832 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 87,780,000; Interior Terminals 23,409,812; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,622,788; Victoria 712,554; Prince Rupert 1,138,134; Churchill 2,494,610; Fort William and Port Arthur 80,388,354; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,538,949 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,466,815 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 7,970,000; Interior Terminals 401,860; Vancouver-New Westminster 24,547; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,908,678; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,588,537; Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 276,145 bushels, while decreases were shown at Victoria of 798 and Prince Rupert 885 bushels.

For the week ending September 13, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,961,321 bushels and in transit by rail 15,807,649 compared with 5,000,507 in transit on the lakes and 28,658,708 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 35,500,333 bushels, an increase of 2,324,894 bushels over the previous week when 33,175,439 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 5,969,253; Buffalo 3,765,000; Buffalo Afloat 165,000; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 1,718,000; Chicago 36,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 2,026,000; New York Afloat 396,000; Albany 8,737,000; Philadelphia 1,017,588; Boston 2,231,839; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 2,075,722 bushels.

Increases were noted at Duluth of 2,138,214; Buffalo 446,000; Erie Canal 296,000; New York 538,000; New York Afloat 33,000; and Albany 145,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 453,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 823,320 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,276,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 2,124,000; Buffalo Afloat 215,000; Erie 792,000; Erie Canal 180,000; New York 1,227,000 and Albany 3,738,000 bushels.



#### EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 6, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,303,726 bushels. This compared with 3,187,047 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to September 6, 1940 was 9,834,290 bushels compared with 13,734,810 bushels a year ago.

During the week ending September 13, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,107,568 bushels. This compared with 1,059,101 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to September 13, 1940 was 10,941,858 bushels compared with 14,793,911 bushels a year ago.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 13, 1940 amounted to 16,264,339 bushels, an increase of 610,698 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 16,875,037 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 42,806,627 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 13, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939; Manitoba 2,958,215 (5,223,075); Saskatchewan 11,708,782 (29,425,707); Alberta 1,597,342 (8,157,845) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the six weeks from August 1, 1940 to September 13, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 12,968,818 (38,223,675); Saskatchewan 40,676,969 (78,876,217); Alberta 11,948,547 (27,882,921) bushels. For the six weeks ending September 13, 1940 and the same period in 1939, 65,594,334 and 144,982,813 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending September 14, 1940 amounted to 4,890,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,029,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,105,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,342,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 123,000 bushels.

During the first six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 32,893,000 bushels as compared with 58,318,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 18,241,000 bushels as compared with 24,296,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 13,468,000 bushels during the first six weeks of the present crop year as compared with 20,744,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first six weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939;

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 9.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 3.0 million bushels as compared with 4.0 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 380,131 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in wheat of 167,928; oats 189,629; barley 13,922 and corn 11,205 bushels, while rye and soya beans increased 158 and 2,395 bushels respectively.
