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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 27, 1940 increased 32,396,573 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 103,865,749 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 390,292,610 bushels compared with 357,896,037 bushels for the previous week and 286,426,861 bushels for the week of September 29, 1939. The stocks of 390,292,610 bushels include 9,323,134 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 27, 1940 were 352,981,708 bushels compared with 321,704,823 bushels for the previous week and 274,840,861 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 134,680,000; Interior Terminals 23,784,943; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,305,692; Victoria 637,887; Prince Rupert 1,135,164; Churchill 2,539,983; Fort William and Port Arthur 81,683,185; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,928,303 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,724,337 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 26,380,000; Interior Terminals 227,829; Churchill 45,373; Fort William and Port Arthur 209,419; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 855,310 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 69,698 bushels, while Vancouver-New Westminster decreased 159,073 bushels.

For the week ending September 27, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,998,742 bushels and in transit by rail 22,563,472 compared with 4,055,858 in transit on the lakes and 37,720,137 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 37,310,902 bushels, and increase of 1,119,688 bushels over the previous week when 36,191,214 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 6,752,265; Buffalo 6,990,000; Buffalo Afloat 179,000; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 530,000; Chicago 29,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; New York 3,111,000; New York Afloat 472,000; Albany 9,073,000; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted 2,289,279 bushels.

Increases were shown at Duluth of 410,613; Buffalo 320,000; New York 503,000; Albany 177,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 66,075 bushels, while decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 136,000; Erie Canal Afloat 18,000 and New York Afloat 203,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,586,000 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 2,766,000; Buffalo Afloat 714,000; Erie 1,330,000; Erie Canal 262,000; New York 2,916,000; Albany 3,365,000 and Baltimore 233,000 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 27, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,143,545 bushels. This compared with 2,696,100 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to September 27, 1940 was 13,460,906 bushels compared with 21,600,859 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 27, 1940 amounted to 34,008,990 bushels, an increase of 5,158,459 bushels over the revised figure of the previous week when 28,850,531 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 45,909,713 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 27, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 4,027,000 (2,887,312); Saskatchewan 19,779,981 (26,351,552); Alberta 10,202,000 (16,670,849) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eight weeks from August 1, 1940 to September 27, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 22,534,635 (43,677,321); Saskatchewan 78,173,347 (130,014,377); Alberta 27,909,091 (54,876,033) bushels. For the eight weeks ending September 27, 1940 and the same period 1939, 128,617,073 and 228,567,731 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending September 28, 1940 amounted to 3,461,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,421,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,450,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,000,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 944,000 bushels.

During the first eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 41,761,000 bushels as compared with 75,526,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 23,104,000 bushels as compared with 32,416,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 17,217,000 bushels during the first eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with 26,656,000 bushels for the same period in 1939.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first eight weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.2 million bushels as compared with 9.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 2.9 million bushels as compared with 4.0 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN IN STORE - COMPARATIVE STATEMENT, 1938 - 1940
