WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 4, 1940 increased 21,031,855 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 104,960,910 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1939. The amount in store was reported as 411,324,465 bushels compared with 390,292,610 bushels for the previous week and 306,363,555 bushels for the week of October 6, 1939. The stocks of 411,324,465 bushels include 9,337,145 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 4, 1940 were 373,512,622 bushels compared with 352,981,708 bushels for the previous week and 291,922,555 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 152,530,000; Interior Terminals 23,763,934; Vancouver-New Westminster 15,223,269; Victoria 636,887; Prince Rupert 1,135,164; Churchill 2,611,802; Fort William and Port Arthur 82,690,757; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,590,553 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,368,472 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 17,850,000; Churchill 71,819 and Fort William and Port Arthur 1,007,572, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 21,009; Vancouver-New Westminster 82,423; Victoria 1,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 337,750 and Eastern Elevator Seaboard Ports 355,865 bushels.

For the week ending October 4, 1940 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,920,689 bushels and in transit by rail 25,041,095 compared with 6,287,013 in transit on the lakes and 35,494,901 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1939.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 37,811,843 bushels, an increase of 500,941 bushels over the previous week when 37,310,902 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 6,732,314; Buffalo 6,115,000; Buffalo Afloat 393,000; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal 195,000; Chicago 29,000; Ogdensburg 334,315; New York 3,226,000; New York Afloat 654,000; Albany 8,874,000; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145 and Baltimore 1,084,377 bushels. In Transit U.S.A. amounted to 3,708,171 bushels.

Increases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 214,000; New York 115,000; New York Afloat 182,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,418,892 bushels, while decreases were noted at Duluth of 19,951; Buffalo 875,000; Erie Canal 335,000 and Albany 199,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,441,000 bushels distributed as follows; Buffalo 4,024,000; Buffalo Afloat 788,000; Erie 1,485,000; Erie Canal 330,000; New York 4,263,000; New York Afloat 144,000; Albany 3,263,000; Baltimore 18,000 and Philadelphia 126,000 bushels.



EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 4, 1940 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,042,780 bushels. This compared with 2,409,468 bushels for the corresponding week in 1939. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1940 to October 4, 1940 was 15,503,686 bushels compared with 24,010,327 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 4, 1940 amounted to 24,180,366 bushels, a decrease of 9,935,200 bushels from the revised figure of the previous week when 34,115,566 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 22,430,411 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 4, 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 2,442,796 (1,085,811); Saskatchewan 13,271,110 (14,639,656); Alberta 8,466,460 (6,704,944) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nine weeks from August 1, 1940 to October 4, 1940 as compared with the same period in 1939 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1939: Manitoba 24,996,273 (44,763,132); Saskatchewan 91,526,318 (144,654,033); Alberta 36,381,424 (61,580,977) bushels. For the nine weeks ending October 4, 1940 and the same period 1939, 152,904,015 and 250,998,142 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending October 5, 1940 amounted to 3,944,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 3,461,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,486,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 765,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 346,000 bushels.

During the first nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 45,701,000 bushels as compared with 94,244,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 25,807,000 bushels as compared with 40,160,000 bushels for the same period in 1939. Argentine shipments amounted to 18,246,000 bushels for the first nine weeks of the present crop year as compared with 31,736,000 bushels for same period in 1939.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first nine weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1939:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.1 million bushels as compared with 9.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1939. North American weekly average shipments were 2.9 million bushels as compared with 4.0 million bushels in the same weeks last year.

United States grain and soya bean stocks were 443,470 bushels lower than at a comparable date last year. Decreases were noted in wheat of 318,850; oats 229,602 and barley 4,068 bushels, while increases were shown in rye of 158; corn 106,493 and soya beans 2,399 bushels.


