WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 24, 1941 increased 11,557,272 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 53,156,322 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 496,682,840 bushels compared with 485,125,568 bushels for the previous week and 443,526,518 bushels for the week of October 25, 1940. The stocks of 496,682,840 bushels include 1,427,812 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending October 24, 1941 were 471,801,962 bushels compared with 459,461,579 bushels for the previous week and 404,333,929 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 226,435,000; Interior Terminals 26,066,136; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,982,522; Victoria 1,020,050; Prince Rupert 1,205,661; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 102,062,232; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 44,569,246 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 29,644,170 bushels.

Increases were noted at Wostern Country Elevators of 7,585,000; Interior Torminals 67,469; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,780,932; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 392,351 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 423,987 bushels, while decreases were shown at Vancouver-New Westminster of 32,794 and Victoria 1,167 bushels.

For the week ending October 24, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,412,985 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,783,294 compared with 3,162,077 in transit on the lakes and 23,630,424 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,880,878 bushels, a decrease of 783,111 bushels from the previous week when 25,663,989 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 733,091; Eire 2,193,000; Erie Canal Afloat 379,000; Buffalo 4,525,000; Buffalo Afloat 480,000; Albany 1,982,000; New York 3,524,000; New York Afloat 1,423,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 657,708; Baltimore 1,046,867 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,280,923 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 230,213; Buffalo Afloat 127,000; Albany 466,000; New York Afloat 45,000; Baltimore 76,064 and In Transit U.S.A. 390,834 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 90,000; Buffalo 441,000 and New York 21,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,192,589 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 7,671,879; Erie 2,016,000; Erie Canal Afloat 219,000; Chicago 18,000; Buffalo 7,571,000; Buffalo Afloat 196,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,948,000; New York 3,372,000; New York Afloat 847,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,113,952; Baltimore 1,244,020 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,143,279 bushels.



- 2 -EXPORT CLEARANCES During the week ending October 24, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,930,042 bushels. This compared with 741,734 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to October 24, 1941 was 31,098,867 bushels compared with 18,901,910 bushels a year ago. PRIMARY MOVEMENT Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 24, 1941 amounted to 13,332,287 bushels, an increase of 4,376,701 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 8,955,586 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 16,189,654 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 24, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940:

Manitoba 2,918,868 (1,188,623); Saskatchewan 5,673,377 (6,617,166); Alberta 4,740,042 (8,383,865) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twelve weeks from August 1, 1941 to October 24, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 14,770,354 (29,089,485); Saskatchewan 47,436,730 (113,215,008); Alberta 19,976,166 (55,354,710) bushels. For the twelve weeks ending October 24, 1941 and the same period in 1940 82,183,250 and 197,659,203 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending October 25, 1941 amounted to 5,510,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,476,000 bushels for last week and 2,168,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 295,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 261,000 bushels.

During the first twelve weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 66,422,000 bushels as compared with 56,624,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North Amorican shipments were 48,287,000 bushels as compared with 33,056,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 18,135,000 bushels during the first twelve weeks of the present crop year as compared with 22,112,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.5 million bushels as compared with 4.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 2.8 million bushels for the same weeks last year.



Duluth: Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the weeks ending October 18 and 25, 1941 were nil.

Lake shipments of wheat for the weeks ending October 18 and 25, 1941 were 47,197 and 230,213 bushels respectively, while rail shipments of barley were 10,000 bushels each week. For the period August 1, 1941 to date lake shipments amounted to wheat 10,130,468 and rail shipments 119,980 bushels.
