WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 21, 1941 decreased 372,935 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 45,015,618 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 503,322,573 bushels compared with 503,695,508 bushels for the previous week and 458,306,955 bushels for the week of November 22, 1940. The stocks of 503,322,573 bushels include 1,489,775 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending November 21, 1941 were 478,725,859 bushels compared with 478,723,483 bushels for the previous week and 412,947,929 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 229,270,000; Interior Terminals 26,230,825; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,053,474; Victoria 1,021,314; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 108,622,539; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,567,244 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 29,310,322 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 100,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 73,535; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,765,860 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 583,234 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 442,344; Victoria 333 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,055,899 bushels.

For the week ending November 21, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,030,996 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,795,868 compared with 5,717,224 in transit on the lakes and 10,578,257 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,596,714 bushels, a decrease of 375,311 bushels from the previous week when 24,972,025 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,069,000; Buffalo 4,846,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,217,000; Albany 549,000; New York 3,470,000; New York Afloat 1,924,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 769,216; Baltimore 1,144,779 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,758,430 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 391,000; Albany 198,000; New York Afloat 110,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 625,311 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 491,000; Buffalo Afloat 328,000 and New York 130,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 45,359,026 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 8,016,924; Erie 1,989,000; Erie Canal Afloat 713,000; Chicago 13,000; Buffalo 7,893,000; Buffalo Afloat 869,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 9,204,000; New York 3,752,000; New York Afloat 900,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,093,607; Baltimore 2,523,844 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,564,192 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 21, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,333,826 bushels. This compared with 3,558,005 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to November 21, 1941 was 43,781,019 bushels compared with 29,930,307 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 21, 1941 amounted to 7,540,334 bushels, a decrease of 393,938 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 7,934,272 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,493,207 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 21, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,407,242 (1,053,873); Saskatchewan 3,561,882 (4,686,398); Alberta 2,571,210 (3,755,936) bushels

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the sixteen weeks from August 1, 1941 to November 21, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 21,446,114 (32,310,490); Saskatchewan 64,201,669 (129,483,335); Alberta 31,994,220 (71,192,321) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 21, 1941 and the same period in 1940 117,642,003 and 232,986,146 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending November 22, 1941 amounted to 5,423,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,244,000 bushels for last week and 6,984,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 587,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 408,000 bushels.


During the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 85,988,000 bushels as compared with 79,680,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 63,257,000 bushels as compared with 48,928,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 22,731,000 bushels during the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 29,136,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 5.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.
