WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 5, 1941 increased 14,897 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 30,646,239 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 502,384,275 bushels compared with 502,369,378 bushels for the previous week and 471,738,036 bushels for the week of December 6, 1940. The stocks of 502,384,275 bushels include 1,514,510 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 5, 1941 were 470,851,713 bushels compared with 473,994,786 bushels for the previous week and 420,372,221 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 229,285,000; Interior Terminals 24,777,010; Vancouver-New Westminster 28,108,652; Victoria 1,029,759; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 96,041,098; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 45,014,024 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 28,981,405 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Interior Terminals of 180,664; Victoria 667; Fort William and Port Arthur 7,928,404 and Eastern Elevator Seaboard Ports 223,925 bushels, while increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 1,170,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 31,086 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,519,060 bushels.

For the week ending December 5, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 9,439,997 bushels, and in transit by rail 14,351,491 compared with 12,469,265 in transit on the lakes and 12,089,395 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,532,562 bushels, an increase of 3,157,970 bushels over the previous week when 28,374,592 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 5,304,000; Buffalo Afloat 4,162,000; Albany 399,000; New York 4,130,000; New York Afloat 2,795,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,241,360; Philadelphia 569,402; Baltimore 927,072 and In Transit U.S.A. 7,461,483 bushels.

Increases were shown at Buffalo of 622,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,175,000; New York Afloat 42,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,054,077 bushels, while decreases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 166,000; Albany 62,000; New York 97,800; Portland 64,684; Philadelphia 199,814 and Baltimore 145,609 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 51,365,815 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 8,489,668; Erie 1,989,000; Chicago 13,000; Buffalo 10,982,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,013,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 9,041,000; New York 3,812,000; New York Afloat 1,367,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 833,976; Baltimore 4,439,662 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,558,050 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 5, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,796,359 bushels. This compared with 2,518,964 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to December 5, 1941 was 49,898,886 bushels compared with 33,447,136 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 5, 1941 amounted to 7,113,264 bushels, an increase of 2,428,548 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 4,684,716 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 10,874,279 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 5, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,678,326 (1,230,882); Saskatchewan 2,970,859 (5,361,449); Alberta 2,464,079 (4,281,948) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eighteen weeks from August 1, 1941 to December 5, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 24,180,130 (34,616,302); Saskatchewan 68,974,422 (139,760,513); Alberta 36,314,498 (79,656,663) bushels. For the eighteen weeks ending December 5, 1941 and the same period in 1940 129,469,050 and 254,033,478 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 6, 1941 amounted to 6,397,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,315,000 bushels for last week and 4,576,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 1,202,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 120,000 bushels.

During the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 97,683,000 bushels as compared with 90,576,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 71,939,000 bushels as compared with 56,408,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 25,744,000 bushels during the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year as compared with 31,760,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.
