WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 12, 1941 increased 1,248,633 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 25,427,685 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 503,632,908 bushels compared with 502,384,275 bushels for the previous week and 478,205,223 bushels for the week of December 13, 1940. The stocks of 503,632,908 bushels include 1,544,987 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 12, 1941 were 469,923,043 bushels compared with 470,851,713 bushels for the previous week and 424,710,698 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 229,135,000; Interior Terminals 24,809,796; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,110,272; Victoria 1,028,593; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 92,435,495; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 45,501,208 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 29,330,161 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 150,000; Victoria 1,166 and Fort William and Port Arthur 3,605,603 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 32,786; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,620; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 487,184 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 348,756 bushels.

For the week ending December 12, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 11,220,842 bushels, and in transit by rail 14,528,399 compared with 11,808,539 in transit on the lakes and 13,816,675 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,709,865 bushels, an increase of 2,177,303 bushels over the previous week when 31,532,562 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 6,151,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,430,000; Albany 224,000; New York 4,624,000; New York Afloat 2,755,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,101,669; Philadelphia 569,402; Baltimore 1,389,827 and In Transit U.S.A. 8,921,722 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 847,000; New York 494,000; Baltimore 462,755 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,460,239 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 732,000; Albany 175,000; New York Afloat 40,000 and Portland 139,691 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 53,494,525 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 9,918,676; Erie 1,989,000; Chicago 13,000; Buffalo 11,031,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,013,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 9,041,000; New York 3,803,000; New York Afloat 1,338,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,151,696; Baltimore 4,726,985 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,641,709 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 12, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,183,113 bushels. This compared with 1,480,527 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to December 12, 1941 was 54,081,999 bushels compared with 34,927,663 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 12, 1941 amounted to 6,998,186 bushels, a decrease of 150,070 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 7,148,256 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,693,336 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 12, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,629,949 (1,151,339); Saskatchewan 2,720,979 (4,718,412); Alberta 2,647,258 (3,823,585) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nineteen weeks from August 1, 1941 to December 12, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 25,817,378 (35,767,641); Saskatchewan 71,696,659 (144,478,925); Alberta 39,988,191 (83,480,248) bushels. For the nineteen weeks ending December 12, 1941 and the same period in 1940 136,502,228 and 263,726,814 bushels were received from the farms.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 3,150,104 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 546,771; oats 9,352; rye 1 and corn 2,610,319 bushels, while barley and soya beans decreased 4 and 16,335 bushels respectively.


