WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 19, 1941 increased 3,908,184 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 23,752,604 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 507,541,092 bushels compared with 503,632,908 bushels for the previous week and 483,788,488 bushels for the week of December 20, 1940. The stocks of 507,541,092 bushels include 1,578,938 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 19, 1941 were 473,597,379 bushels compared with 469,923,043 bushels for the previous week and 429,757,373 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 229,620,000; Interior Terminals 24,582,300; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,110,174; Victoria 1,028,259; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 95,788,149; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 54,807,589 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 29,619,422 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 485,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,352,654; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 9,306,381 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 289,261 bushels, while decreases were noted at Interior Terminals of 227,496; Vancouver-New Westminster 98 and Victoria 334 bushels.

For the week ending December 19, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 16,218,209 bushels compared with 19,234,338 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,943,713 bushels, an increase of 233,848 bushels over the previous week when 33,709,865 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 6,068,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,333,000; Albany 224,000; New York 4,966,000; New York Afloat 2,252,000; Boston 2,349,982; Portland 1,316,045; Philadelphia 569,402; Baltimore 1,389,827 and In Transit U.S.A. 9,282,457 bushels.

Increases were noted at New York of 342,000; Portland 214,376 and In Transit U.S.A. 360,735 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 83,000; Buffalo Afloat 97,000; New York Afloat 503,000 and Boston 263 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 54,031,115 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 11,738,447; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 11,108,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,898,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,822,000; New York 4,020,000; New York Afloat 1,528,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,530,900; Baltimore 4,474,600 and In Transit U.S.A. 5,229,147 bushels.


EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 19, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,030,573 bushels. This compared with 2,037,456 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to December 19, 1941 was 57,112,572 bushels compared with 36,965,119 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 19, 1941 amounted to 5,765,667 bushels, a decrease of 1,427,326 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 7,192,993 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,524,795 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 19, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,369,338 (1,271,675); Saskatchewan 2,235,830 (3,699,576); Alberta 2,160,499 (3,553,544) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty weeks from August 1, 1941 to December 19, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 27,191,653 (37,039,316); Saskatchewan 73,934,739 (148,178,501); Alberta 41,336,310 (87,033,792) bushels. For the twenty weeks ending December 19, 1941 and the same period in 1940 142,462,702 and 272,251,609 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 20, 1941 amounted to 6,015,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,457,000 bushels for last week and 4,944,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 627,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 69,000 bushels.

During the first twenty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 109,151,000 bushels as compared with 100,184,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 81,246,000 bushels as compared with 62,656,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 27,905,000 bushels during the first twenty weeks of the present crop year as compared with 33,400,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.5 million bushels as compared with 5.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.1 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 3,373,176 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 519,788; oats 9,352; rye 1 and corn 2,858,420 bushels, while barley and soya beans decreased 4 and 14,381 bushels respectively.
