WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 26, 1941 decreased 2,573,481 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 12,345,087 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 504,967,611 bushels compared with 507,541,092 bushels for the previous week and 492,622,524 bushels for the week of December 27, 1940. The stocks of 504,967,611 bushels include 1,605,878 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending December 26, 1941 were 471,669,401 bushels compared with 473,597,379 bushels for the previous week and 438,456,931 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 230,660,000; Interior Terminals 24,669,165; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,144,727; Victoria 1,025,757; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 98,052,862; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 53,205,178 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 29,050,889 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 1,040,000; Interior Terminals 86,865; Vancouver-New Westminster 34,553 and Fort William and Port Arthur 2,264,713 bushels, while decreases were noted at Victoria of 2,502; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,602,411 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 568,533 bushels.

For the week ending December 26, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 13,037,546 bushels compared with 19,234,338 bushels for the corresponding period in 1940.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,298,210 bushels, a decrease of 645,503 bushels from the previous week when 33,943,713 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 5,671,000; Buffalo Afloat 3,154,000; Albany 130,000; New York 5,055,000; New York Afloat 2,171,000; Boston 2,389,315; Portland 1,404,916; Philadelphia 772,722; Baltimore 1,366,145 and In Transit U.S.A. 8,991,112 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 397,000; Buffalo Afloat 179,000; Albany 94,000; New York Afloat 81,000; Baltimore 23,682 and In Transit U.S.A. 291,345 bushels, while increases were shown at New York of 89,000; Boston 39,333; Portland 88,871 and Philadelphia 203,320 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 54,165,553 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 11,738,447; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 11,108,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,898,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,822,000; New York 4,020,000; New York Afloat 1,528,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,530,900; Baltimore 4,474,600 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,229,147 bushels.



EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 26, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,331,388 bushels. This compared with 811,473 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to December 26, 1941 was 58,443,960 bushels compared with 37,776,592 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 26, 1941 amounted to 4,184,498 bushels, a decrease of 1,585,637 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 5,770,135 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,580,045 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 26, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 701,528 (1,080,700); Saskatchewan 1,764,861 (4,099,179); Alberta 1,718,109 (3,400,166) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-one weeks from August 1, 1941 to December 26, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 27,913,985 (38,120,016); Saskatchewan 75,700,051 (152,277,680); Alberta 43,037,632 (90,433,958) bushels. For the twenty-one weeks ending December 26, 1941 and the same period in 1940 146,651,668 and 280,831,654 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending December 27, 1941 amounted to 4,289,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,015,000 bushels for last week and 5,024,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,245,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 481,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 113,449,000 bushels as compared with 105,208,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 84,972,000 bushels as compared with 65,304,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 28,477,000 bushels during the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year as compared with 35,128,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 5.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.
