WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 9, 1942 increased 16,520 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 10,032,528 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 502,471,990 bushels compared with 502,455,470 bushels for the previous week and 492,439,462 bushels for the week of January 10, 1941. The stocks of 502,471,990 bushels include 1,549,685 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 9, 1942 were 472,887,531 bushels compared with 471,491,668 bushels for the previous week and 439,623,265 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 230,480,000; Interior Terminals 24,661,013; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,152,212; Victoria 1,024,757; Prince Rupert 1,205,331; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 104,010,813; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 48,506,639 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 30,014,665 bushels.

Increases were shown at Vancouver-New Westminster of 18,671; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,005,346 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 518,631 bushels, while decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 500,000; Interior Terminals 162,405; Victoria 1,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,419,250 bushels.

For the week ending January 9, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 12,213,955 bushels compared with 11,995,881 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 29,584,459 bushels, a decrease of 1,379,343 bushels from the previous week when 30,963,802 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 5,391,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,909,000; New York 4,634,000; New York Afloat 2,147,000; Boston 2,326,277; Portland 1,309,036; Philadelphia 774,302; Baltimore 1,250,654 and In Transit U.S.A. 6,650,190 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 342,000; Buffalo Afloat 50,000; New York 220,000; New York Afloat 280,000; Baltimore 194,838 and In Transit U.S.A. 414,539 bushels, while increases were shown at Boston of 113,337; Portland 7,117 and Philadelphia 1,580 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 52,813,197 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 12,286,662; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 11,200,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,451,000; Ogdensburg 334,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 3,969,000; New York Afloat 1,466,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,625,171; Baltimore 3,846,092 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,848,813 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 9, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,278,962 bushels. This compared with 3,021,370 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to January 9, 1942 was 63,568,329 bushels compared with 41,709,125 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 9, 1942 amounted to 1,626,687 bushels, a decrease of 1,703,910 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 3,330,597 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 3,039,974 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 9, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 343,273 (352,674); Saskatchewan 612,972 (1,185,210); Alberta 670,442 (1,502,090) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-three weeks from August 1, 1941 to January 9, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 28,961,705 (39,526,689); Saskatchewan 77,813,831 (156,125,871); Alberta 44,867,002 (94,977,328) bushels. For the twenty-three weeks ending January 9, 1942 and the same period in 1941 151,642,538 and 290,629,888 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending January 10, 1942 amounted to 4,331,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,432,000 bushels for last week and 3,344,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 1,352,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 251,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 123,371,000 bushels as compared with 111,936,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 92,125,000 bushels as compared with 70,008,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 31,246,000 bushels during the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year as compared with 37,040,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940-41:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 4.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940-41. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.0 million bushels for the same weeks last year.
