WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 16, 1942 decreased 4,483,842 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 3,783,115 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 497,988,148 bushels compared with 502,471,990 bushels for the previous week and 494,205,033 bushels for the week of January 17, 1941. The stocks of 497,988,148 bushels include 1,543,733 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 16, 1942 were 469,613,521 bushels compared with 472,887,531 bushels for the previous week and 443,379,567 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 229,425,000; Interior Terminals 24,129,599; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,091,115; Victoria 1,024,757; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 106,157,321; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 46,691,573 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 28,717,712 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 1,055,000; Interior Terminal 531,414; Vancouver-New Westminster 61,097; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,815,266 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,296,953 bushels, while Fort William and Port Arthur increased 2,146,508 bushels.

For the week ending January 16, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 11,553,167 bushels compared with 9,057,989 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 28,374,627 bushels, a decrease of 1,209,832 bushels from the previous week when 29,584,459 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 5,224,000; Buffalo Afloat 2,448,000; New York 4,532,000; New York Afloat 1,843,000; Boston 2,326,277; Portland 956,178; Philadelphia 774,302; Baltimore 1,250,654 and In Transit U.S.A. 6,827,216 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 167,000; Buffalo Afloat 461,000; New York 102,000; New York Afloat 304,000 and Portland 352,858 bushels, while an increase was shown at In Transit U.S.A. of 177,026 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 50,825,466 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 12,396,254; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 10,768,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,451,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 3,875,000; New York Afloat 1,223,000; Boston 1,887,254; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,655,040; Baltimore 2,663,136 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,015,322 bushels.


EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 16, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,291,422 bushels. This compared with 1,620,862 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to January 16, 1942 was 67,859,751 bushels compared with 43,229,987 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 16, 1942 amounted to 2,178,397 bushels, an increase of 377,746 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 1,800,651 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,787,214 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 16, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 388,365 (612,398); Saskatchewan 796,939 (2,323,658); Alberta 993,093 (2,851,158) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-four weeks from August 1, 1941 to January 16, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 29,360,211 (40,139,087); Saskatchewan 78,619,300 (158,449,529); Alberta 46,015,388 (97,828,486) bushels. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 16, 1942 and the same period in 1941 153,994,899 and 296,417,102 bushels were received from the farms.



EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,816,434 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 250,002; oats 7,470; rye 1 and corn 2,589,558 bushels, while barley and soya beans decreased 4 and 10,593 bushels respectively.


