WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 23, 1942 decreased 3,842,220 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 1,695,649 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 494,145,928 bushels compared with 497,988,148 bushels for the previous week and 495,841,577 bushels for the week of January 24, 1941. The stocks of 494,145,928 bushels include 1,542,120 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending January 23, 1942 were 467,613,607 bushels compared with 469,613,521 bushels for the previous week and 446,571,224 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 225,665,000; Interior Terminals 23,846,066; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,074,348; Victoria 1,026,922; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 108,300,999; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 43,864,596 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 28,453,084 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 3,760,000; Interior Terminals 283,533; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,767; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,826,977 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 264,628 bushels, while increases were shown at Victoria of 2,165 and Fort William and Port Arthur 2,143,678 bushels.

For the week ending January 23, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 14,559,315 bushels compared with 7,964,600 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,532,321 bushels, a decrease of 1,842,306 bushels from the previous week when 28,374,627 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 5,064,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,821,000; New York 4,478,000; New York Afloat 1,468,000; Boston 2,104,814; Portland 1,310,907; Philadelphia 781,450; Baltimore 1,430,911 and In Transit U.S.A. 5,880,239 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo of 160,000; Buffalo Afloat 627,000; New York 54,000; New York Afloat 375,000; Boston 221,463 and In Transit U.S.A. 946,977 bushels, while increases were noted at Portland of 354,729; Philadelphia 7,148 and Baltimore 180,257 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 49,270,353 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 12,555,454; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 9,941,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,451,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 844,000; New York Afloat 1,143,000; Boston 1,887,254; Portland 1,168,164; Philadelphia 1,058,742; Baltimore 2,210,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,330,821 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 23, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,812,135 bushels. This compared with 3,746,069 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to January 23, 1942 was 71,671,886 bushels compared with 46,976,056 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 23, 1942 amounted to 2,973,826 bushels, an increase of 794,503 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 2,179,323 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,360,755 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 23, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 625,171 (431,055); Saskatchewan 1,228,736 (2,483,851); Alberta 1,119,919 (2,445,849) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-five weeks from August 1, 1941 to January 23, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 29,985,489 (40,570,142); Saskatchewan 79,848,855 (160,933,380); Alberta 47,135,307 (100,274,335) bushels. For the twenty-five weeks ending January 23, 1942 and the same period in 1941 156,969,651 and 301,777,857 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending January 24, 1942 amounted to 6,954,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,925,000 bushels for last week and 4,416,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 529,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 500,000 bushels.


During the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 136,170,000 bushels as compared with 119,944,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 101,204,000 bushels as compared with 76,424,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 34,966,000 bushels during the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year as compared with 38,632,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940-41:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 4.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940-41. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.


