WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 6, 1942 decreased 2,412,127 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 4,242,423 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 487,828,778 bushels compared with 490,240,905 bushels for the previous week and 492,071,201 bushels for the week of February 7, 1941. The stocks of 487,828,778 bushels include 1,500,937 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 6, 1942 were 464,648,469 bushels compared with 465,608,037 bushels for the previous week and 444,127,957 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 219,990,000; Interior Terminals 23,763,825; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,094,806; Victoria 1,031,711; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 116,210,362; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 41,204,295 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 27,800,892 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,900,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,398,181 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 722,308 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Terminals of 33,953; Vancouver-New Westminster 3,028; Victoria 187 and Fort William and Port Arthur 4,280,621 bushels.

For the week ending February 6, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 12,729,301 bushels compared with 6,523,405 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,180,309 bushels, a decrease of 1,452,559 bushels from the previous week when 24,632,868 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 4,279,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,335,000; New York 3,781,000; New York Afloat 1,247,000; Boston 2,058,457; Portland 1,272,148; Philadelphia 843,845; Baltimore 1,349,035 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,281,824 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 303,000; Buffalo Afloat 184,000; New York 788,000; New York Afloat 68,000; Portland 38,759 and In Transit U.S.A. 245,880 bushels, while Baltimore increased 175,080 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 47,943,244 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 13,104,870; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 9,426,000; Buffalo Afloat 1,153,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 3,479,000; New York Afloat 1,130,000; Boston 2,345,334; Portland 1,104,722; Philadelphia 1,149,075; Baltimore 1,967,879 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,403,049 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 6, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,743,661 bushels. This compared with 4,281,530 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to February 6, 1942 was 77,267,120 bushels compared with 54,965,130 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 6, 1942 amounted to 1,863,047 bushels, a decrease of 827,363 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 2,690,410 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,793,056 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 6, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 408,491 (563,357); Saskatchewan 823,635 (2,089,115); Alberta 630,921 (2,140,584) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-seven weeks from August 1, 1941 to February 6, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 31,041,986 (41,471,921); Saskatchewan 81,887,840 (164,428,992); Alberta 48,669,693 (103,722,974) bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 6, 1942 and the same period in 1941 161,599,519 and 309,693,887 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending February 7, 1942 amounted to 4,627,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,374,000 bushels for last week and 3,808,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 901,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 154,000 bushels.


During the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 146,144,000 bushels as compared with 128,416,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 109,084,000 bushels as compared with 83,112,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 37,060,000 bushels during the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year as compared with 40,416,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940-41:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 4.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940-41. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.



EASTERN ELEVATORS: United States grain and soya bean stocks were 2,604,592 bushels higher than at a comparable date last year. Increases were noted in wheat of 140,063; oats 7,470; rye 1 and corn 2,460,436 bushels, while barley and soya beans decreased 4 and 3,374 bushels respectively.
