WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 13, 1942 decreased 1,658,632 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 5,958,461 bushels, when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 486,170,146 bushels compared with 487,828,778 bushels for the previous week and 492,128,607 bushels for the week of February 14, 1941. The stocks of 486,170,146 bushels include 1,430,225 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending February 13, 1942 were 463,757,244 bushels compared with 464,648,469 bushels for the previous week and 445,633,334 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 217,075,000; Interior Terminals 23,727,696; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,088,686; Victoria 1,031,711; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 120,051,580; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 39,454,862 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 27,867,308 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,915,000; Interior Terminals 36,129 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,749,433 bushels while increases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster of 6,120; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,841,218 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 66,604 bushels.

For the week ending February 13, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 12,636,936 bushels compared with 6,267,864 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 22,412,902 bushels, a decrease of 767,407 bushels from the previous week when 23,180,309 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,193,000; Buffalo 4,176,000; Buffalo Afloat 909,000; New York 3,902,000; New York Afloat 830,000; Boston 2,058,457; Portland 1,295,725; Philadelphia 843,845; Baltimore 1,526,879 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,677,996 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 103,000; Buffalo Afloat 426,000; New York Afloat 417,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 143,828 bushels, while increases were shown at New York of 121,000; Portland 23,577 and Baltimore 177,844 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 46,495,273 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 13,553,786; Erie 1,989,000; Buffalo 9,305,000; Buffalo Afloat 904,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 3,145,000; New York Afloat 1,025,000; Boston 1,965,467; Portland 1,114,818; Philadelphia 988,671; Baltimore 1,626,116 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,187,100 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 13, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,777,027 bushels. This compared with 3,594,488 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to February 13, 1942 was 79,044,147 bushels compared with 58,559,618 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 13, 1942 amounted to 1,773,971 bushels, a decrease of 158,424 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 1,932,395 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,801,616 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 13, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 369,045 (411,038); Saskatchewan 747,484 (2,659,911); Alberta 657,442 (2,730,667) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the twenty-eight weeks from August 1, 1941 to February 13, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 31,417,710 (41,882,959); Saskatchewan 82,645,728 (167,158,903); Alberta 49,379,400 (106,453,641) bushels. For the twenty-eight weeks ending February 13, 1942 and the same period in 1941 163,438,838 and 315,442,503 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending February 14, 1942 amounted to 4,579,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 4,627,000 bushels for last week and 5,688,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 269,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 221,000 bushels.

During the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 150,723,000 bushels as compared with 134,104,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 112,303,000 bushels as compared with 87,784,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 38,420,000 bushels during the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year as compared with 41,432,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940-41:

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.4 million bushels as compared with 4.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940-41. North American weekly average shipments were 4.0 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

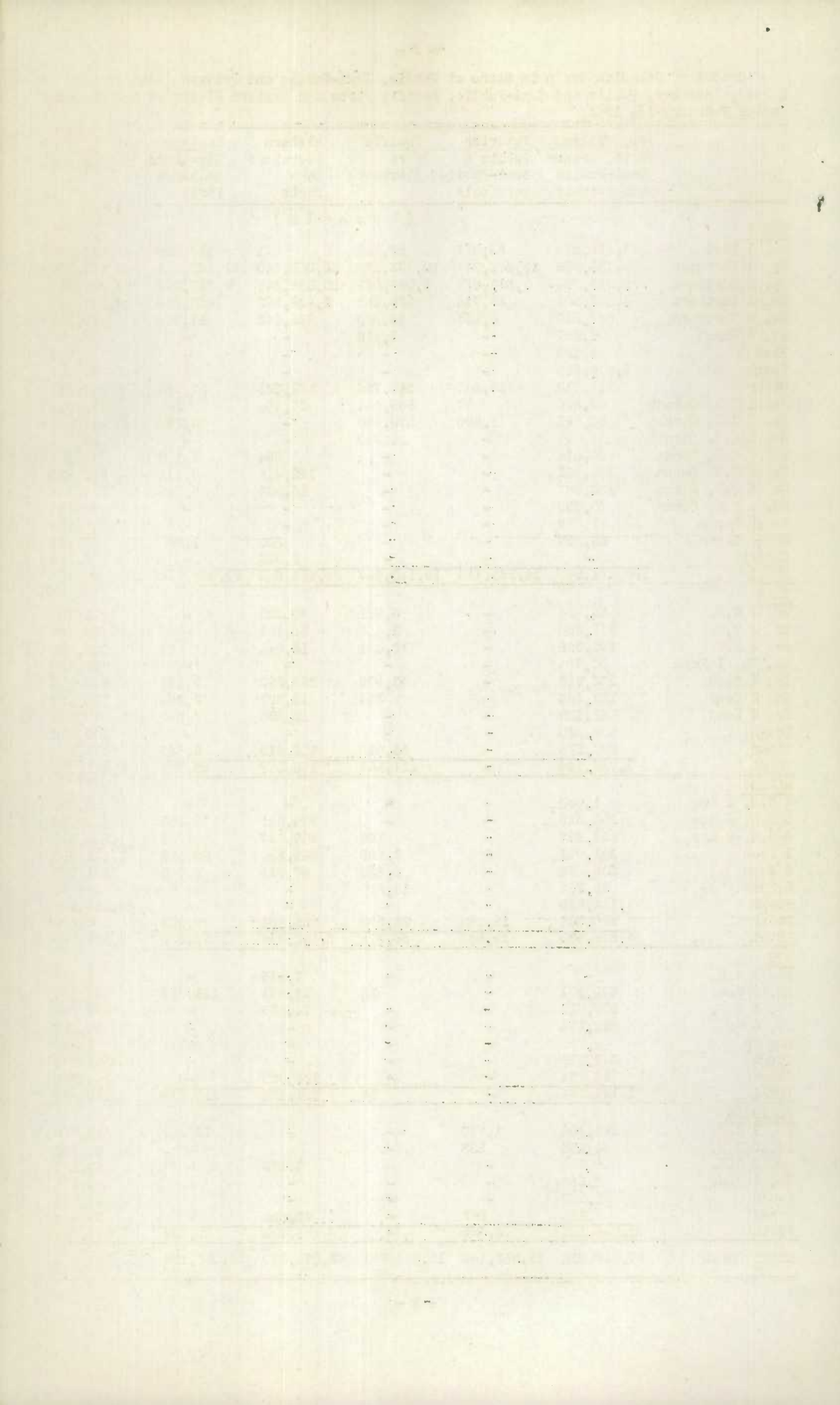
