#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 13, 1942 decreased 3,456,284 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 14,776,930 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 471,618,195 bushels compared with 475,074,479 bushels for the previous week and 486,395,125 bushels for the week of March 14, 1941. The stocks of 471,618,195 bushels include 1,430,040 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending March 13, 1942 were 452,411,750 bushels compared with 455,086,294 bushels for the previous week and 440,656,933 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 205,665,000; Interior Terminals 23,826,706; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,114,633; Victoria 1,027,762; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 129,611,248; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 31,270,259 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,681,104 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,905,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,711,921 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,510,741 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Terminals of 168,004; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,835 and Fort William and Port Arthur 2,310,935 bushels.

For the week ending March 13, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit by rail was 15,392,031 bushels compared with 11,453,527 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941.



#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,206,445 bushels, a decrease of 781,740 bushels from the previous week when 19,988,185 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Erie 2,251,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,505,000; Buffalo 4,180,000; Buffalo Afloat 244,000; New York 3,005,000; New York Afloat 399,000; Boston 2,158,462; Portland 1,113,208; Philadelphia 564,967; Baltimore 1,481,767 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,304,041 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Erie Canal Afloat of 445,000; Buffalo 67,000; New York 197,000; New York Afloat 131,000; and In Transit U.S.A. 131,982 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie of 40,000; Boston 47,489 and Portland 102,753 bushels.


For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 45,738,192 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,652,571; Erie 1,545,000; Buffalo 7,980,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,307,000; New York 2,664,000; New York Afloat 255,000; Boston 1,660,517; Portland 1,206,694; Philadelphia 633,771; Baltimore 1,406,533 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,042,791 bushels.



- 2 -EXPORT CLEARANCES During the week ending March 13, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,195,781 bushels. This compared with 4,231,980 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period August 1, 1941 to March 13, 1942 was 90,293,391 bushels compared with 73,672,646 bushels a year ago, PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 13, 1942 amounted to 2,254,276 bushels, an increase of 605,615 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 1,648,661 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,925,196 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 13, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 528,425 (623,016); Saskatchewan 1,026,575 (2,272,454); Alberta 699,276 (2,029,726) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the thirtytwo weeks from August 1, 1941 to March 13, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 33,062,271 (43,212,273); Saskatchewan 85,489,881 (175,657,076); Alberta 51,550,349 (113,430,008) bushels. For the thirty—two weeks ending March 13, 1942 and the same period in 1941 170, 102, 501 and 330, 229, 357 bushels were received from the farms.


World shipments for the week ending March 14, 1942 amounted to 5,750,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,092,000 bushels for last week and 7,760,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase over the previous week of 861,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 1,203,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 170,461,000 bushels as compared with 157,504,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 126,464,000 bushels as compared with 104,840,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 43,997,000 bushels during the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year as compared with 47,776,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.
