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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 29, 1941 increased 3,829,791 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 162,279,859 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 466,149,615 bushels compared with 462,319,824 bushels for the previous week and 303,869,756 bushels for the week of August 30, 1940. The stocks of 466,149,615 bushels include 1,847,834 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending August 29, 1941 were 438,088,494 bushels compared with 432,488,167 bushels for the previous week and 272,360,464 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 210,350,000; Interior Terminals 26,426,574; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,830,572; Victoria 1,016,247; Prince Rupert 1,207,975; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 92,529,475; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 40,540,408 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 24,405,330 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 2,015,000; Interior Terminals 69,591; Vancouver-New Westminster 24,695; Victoria 7,104; Fort William and Port Arthur 4,212,375 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 403,515 bushels, while Eastern Elevators Lake Ports decreased 467,180 bushels.

For the week ending August 29, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 4,233,121 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,931,396 compared with 3,036,669 in transit on the lakes and 14,596,757 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 28,061,121 bushels, a decrease of 1,770,536 bushels from the previous week when 29,831,657 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 6,204,203; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 486,000; Buffalo 5,052,000; Buffalo Afloat 219,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,247,000; New York Afloat 816,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 964,748 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,884,602 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 1,931,615; Buffalo 209,000 and New York Afloat 69,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 109,000; Buffalo Afloat 87,000; New York 163,000; Boston 35,461 and In Transit U.S.A. 44,618 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,509,292 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,508,731; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,080,000; Chicago 36,000; Buffalo 6,918,000; Buffalo Afloat 233,000; Ogdenburg 384,315; Albany 8,487,000; New York 1,558,000; New York Afloat 132,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,671,203 bushels.

THE NEW YORK STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM, established in 1962, has been a major factor in the development of higher education in the state. This report examines the effects of the system on the state's economy, society, and culture.

THE NEW YORK STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

The New York State University System, established in 1962, is a public university system that includes the State University of New York (SUNY) and the City University of New York (CUNY). The system is designed to provide a wide range of educational opportunities for the people of New York State.

THE EFFECTS OF THE NEW YORK STATE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM

The effects of the New York State University System on the state's economy, society, and culture are examined in this report. The system has had a significant impact on the state's economy, society, and culture.

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### EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending August 29, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,915,228 bushels. This compared with 2,861,338 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to August 29, 1941 was 11,402,662 bushels compared with 7,374,886 bushels a year ago.

### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 29, 1941 amounted to 7,629,179 bushels, an increase of 1,362,548 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 6,266,631 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 15,120,395 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 29, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,840,393 (3,614,022); Saskatchewan 4,250,597 (9,079,696); Alberta 1,538,189 (2,426,677) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the four weeks from August 1, 1941 to August 29, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 4,718,877 (8,025,383); Saskatchewan 9,237,633 (18,065,472); Alberta 4,459,701 (6,663,761) bushels. For the four weeks ending August 29, 1941 and the same period in 1940 18,416,211 and 32,754,616 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending August 30, 1941 amounted to 5,531,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,029,000 bushels for the previous week and 5,456,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 561,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 63,000 bushels.

During the first four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 24,428,000 bushels as compared with 21,960,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 17,110,000 bushels as compared with 11,576,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 7,318,000 bushels during the first four weeks of the present crop year as compared with 9,664,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first four weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.
