WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 8, 1942 decreased 3,958,276 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 38,168,332 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 432,259,244 bushels compared with 436,217,520 bushels for the previous week and 470,427,576 bushels for the week of May 9, 1941. The stocks of 432,259,244 bushels include 1,178,815 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 8, 1942 were 415,029,659 bushels compared with 420,880,025 bushels for the previous week and 436,584,971 bushels for the week ending May 9, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 176,295,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,235,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 17,202,634; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,007,823; Victoria 1,022,762; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 114,154,427; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 34,060,234 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 18,458,733 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 7,495,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 77,834; Victoria 1,667; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,635,172 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 667,257 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill of 135,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 7,018 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,505,233 bushels.

For the week ending May 8, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 7,884,521 bushels, and in transit by rail 17,885,248 compared with 6,827,268 in transit on the lakes and 21,350,527 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,229,585 bushels, an increase of 1,892,090 bushels over the previous week when 15,229,585 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,232,000; Buffalo Afloat 507,000; Erie 2,041,000; Erie Canal Afloat 430,000; Portland 287,150; Boston 1,920,798; New York 1,537,000; New York Afloat 223,000; Philadelphia 368,342; Baltimore 1,205,958 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,477,337 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 34,000; Buffalo Afloat 132,000; Erie Canal Afloat 338,000; Portland 236,513; Boston 466,741; New York 589,000; New York Afloat 52,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 200,721 bushels, while decreases were shown at Philadelphia of 78,013 and Baltimore 78,872 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,842,605 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,661,101; Erie 1,011,000; Erie Canal Afloat 276,000; Buffalo 3,448,000; Buffalo Afloat 771,000; Albany 5,421,000; New York 1,153,000; New York Afloat 565,000; Boston 897,264; Portland 59,537; Philadelphia 490,943; Baltimore 1,513,022 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,575,738 bushels.




EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending May 8, 1942 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 4,522,910 bushels. This compared with 8,010,766 bushels for the corresponding week in 1941. The accumulated total for the period August 1, 1941 to May 8, 1942 was 126,235,564 bushels compared with 118,902,608 bushels.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 8, 1942 amounted to 1,040,840 bushels, a decrease of 414,285 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 1,455,125 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 7,066,790 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 8, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 112,305 (776,993); Saskatchewan 582,843 (3,554,675); Alberta 345,692 (2,735,122) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty weeks from August 1, 1941 to May 8, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 34,911,735 (48,291,941); Saskatchewan 91,601,764 (194,876,078); Alberta 56,393,989 (131,322,106) bushels. For the forty weeks ending May 8, 1942 and the same period in 1941 182,907,488 and 374,490,125 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending May 9, 1942 amounted to 6,808,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,944,000 bushels for last week and 12,352,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 409,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 273,000 bushels.

During the first forty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 227,474,000 bushels as compared with 230,888,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 169,783,000 bushels as compared with 159,792,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41. Argentine shipments amounted to 57,691,000 bushels during the first forty weeks of the present crop year as compared with 66,208,000 bushels for the same period in 1940-41.
