WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 15, 1942 decreased 7,947,550 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 41,762,612 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 424,311,694 bushels compared with 432,259,244 bushels for the previous week and 466,074,306 bushels for the week of May 16, 1941. The stocks of 424,311,694 bushels include 1,119,594 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 15, 1942 were 405,809,671 bushels compared with 415,029,659 bushels for the previous week and 431,292,996 bushels for the week ending May 16, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 168,700,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,284,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 17,183,167; Vancouver-New Westminster 18,006,570; Victoria 1,022,429; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 114,322,647; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 36,801,584 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 16,891,299 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 7,595,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,467; Vancouver-New Westminster 1,253; Victoria 333 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,567,434 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill of 49,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 168,220 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 2,741,350 bushels.

For the week ending May 15, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,780,232 bushels, and in transit by rail 19,994,466 compared with 6,024,805 in transit on the lakes and 22,360,036 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 18,502,023 bushels, an increase of 1,272,438 bushels over the previous week when 17,229,585 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,639,000; Buffalo Afloat 243,000; Erie 2,155,000; Erie Canal Afloat 623,000; Portland 446,309; Boston 2,217,694; New York 1,857,000; New York Afloat 214,000; Philadelphia 368,342; Baltimore 1,286,784; Albany 108,000; and In Transit U.S.A. 3,343,894 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 407,000; Erie 114,000; Erie Canal Afloat 193,000; Portland 159,159; Boston 296,896; New York 320,000; Baltimore 80,826 and Albany 108,000 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 264,000; New York Afloat 9,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 133,443 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 34,781,308 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,661,101; Erie 2,068,000; Buffalo 3,990,000; Buffalo Afloat 476,000; Albany 4,425,000; New York 1,247,000; New York Afloat 677,000; Boston 1,703,481; Portland 350,442; Philadelphia 272,224; Baltimore 1,552,565 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,358,495 bushels.



PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 15, 1942 amounted to 1,402,709 bushels, an increase of 333,267 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 1,069,442 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,679,294 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 15, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 276,337 (631,555); Saskatchewan 769,932 (3,711,574); Alberta 356,440 (2,336,165) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-one weeks from August 1, 1941 to May 15, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 35,188,825 (48,923,496) Saskatchewan 92,371,978 (198,587,652); Alberta 56,777,996 (133,658,271) bushels. For the forty-one weeks ending May 15, 1942 and the same period in 1941 184,338,799 and 381,169,419 bushels were received from the farms.
