

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 22, 1942 decreased 3,618,981 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 43,651,362 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 420,692,713 bushels compared with 424,311,694 bushels for the previous week and 464,344,075 bushels for the week of May 23, 1941. The stocks of 420,692,713 bushels include 975,843 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending May 22, 1942 were 401,083,768 bushels compared with 405,809,571 bushels for the previous week and 426,482,840 bushels for the week ending May 21, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 162,550,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,331,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 17,009,511; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,993,237; Victoria 1,022,074; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 115,547,042; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 36,772,643 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 17,359,848 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 6,150,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 173,656; Vancouver-New Westminster 13,333; Victoria 355 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 28,941 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill of 47,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,224,395 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 463,549 bushels.

For the week ending May 22, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,541,924 bushels, and in transit by rail 19,133,212 compared with 4,600,772 in transit on the lakes and 19,911,817 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,608,945 bushels, an increase of 1,106,922 bushels over the previous week when 18,502,023 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,661,000; Buffalo Afloat 456,000; Erie 2,133,000; Erie Canal Afloat 403,000; Portland 442,759; Boston 2,290,121; New York 1,943,000; New York Afloat 523,000; Philadelphia 368,342; Baltimore 1,290,021 Albany 218,000; and In Transit U.S.A. 3,880,702 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 22,000; Buffalo Afloat 213,000; Boston 72,427; New York 86,000; New York Afloat 309,000; Baltimore 3,237; Albany 110,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 536,808 bushels, while decreases were shown at Erie of 22,000; Erie Canal Afloat 220,000 and Portland 3,550 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 37,861,235 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,661,001; Erie 2,254,000; Buffalo 5,099,000; Buffalo Afloat 185,000; Albany 3,835,000; New York 1,079,000; New York Afloat 904,000; Boston 1,730,181; Portland 617,173; Philadelphia 371,853; Baltimore 1,373,100 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,536,827 and Erie Canal Afloat 415,000 bushels.



PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 22, 1942 amounted to 1,967,007 bushels, an increase of 541,453 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 1,426,354 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 7,353,838 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending May 22, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 326,210 (872,728); Saskatchewan 1,141,728 (4,287,543); Alberta 499,869 (2,793,567) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-two weeks from August 1, 1941 to May 22, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 35,522,294 (49,796,224); Saskatchewan 93,527,005 (202,875,195); Alberta 57,280,952 (135,851,838) bushels. For the forty-two weeks ending May 22, 1942 and the same period in 1941 186,330,251 and 388,523,257 bushels were received from the farms.


