WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 5, 1942 decreased 5,549,019 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 55,376,925 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 413,457,278 bushels compared with 419,006,297 bushels for the previous week and 468,834,203 bushels for the week of June 6, 1941. The stocks of 413,457,278 bushels include 813,667 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending June 5, 1942 were 392,537,789 bushels compared with 398,178,119 bushels for the previous week and 429,109,451 bushels for the week ending June 6, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 147,460,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,274,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 16,960,811; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,833,598; Victoria 1,020,554; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 119,301,247; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 37,348,996 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 16,972,988 bushels,

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 8,815,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 16,942; Vancouver-New Westminster 101,192; Victoria 1,187 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 621,788 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Private and Mill of 105,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,071,441 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 631,445 bushels.

For the week ending June 5, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,265,652 bushels, and in transit by rail 23,276,666 compared with 3,885,174 in transit on the lakes and 20,212,654 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,919,489 bushels, an increase of 91,311 bushels over the previous week when 20,828,178 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 6,530,000; Erie 2,133,000; Erie Canal Afloat 517,000; Portland 466,951; Boston 2,137,294; New York 2,373,000; New York Afloat 651,000; Philadelphia 368,342; Baltimore 1,134,400; Albany 157,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,451,502 bushels.

Increases were shown at Buffalo of 482,000; Erie Canal Afloat 258,000 and New York Afloat 168,000 bushels, while decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 184,000; Portland 21,500; Boston 152,827; New York 83,000; Baltimore 128,166; Albany 32,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 215,196 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,724,752 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,661,101; Erie 2,315,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,187,000; Buffalo 6,289,000; Buffalo Afloat 205,000; Albany 2,944,000; New York 1,525,000; New York Afloat 836,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,143,586; Philadelphia 449,731; Baltimore 1,438,806 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,381,408 bushels.

CENSUS OF 1900

THE CENSUS OF 1900 WAS TAKEN ON APRIL 15, 1900, AND THE RESULTS WERE ANNOUNCED ON APRIL 22, 1900. THE CENSUS WAS TAKEN IN ALL THE STATES AND TERRITORIES OF THE UNITED STATES, AND IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

GENERAL RESULTS

THE CENSUS OF 1900 SHOWS THAT THE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES HAS INCREASED FROM 62,098,582 IN 1890 TO 76,212,382 IN 1900. THIS IS AN INCREASE OF 22.5 PER CENT. THE INCREASE WAS NOT UNIFORM IN ALL PARTS OF THE COUNTRY, BUT WAS MOST MARKED IN THE WEST AND NORTHWEST.

POPULATION BY SEX AND AGE

PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 5, 1942 amounted to 2,172,194 bushels, an increase of 165,030 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 2,007,164 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,641,496 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 5, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 408,175 (744,413); Saskatchewan 1,282,571 (5,894,795); Alberta 461,448 (2,002,288) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-four weeks from August 1, 1941 to June 5, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 36,320,709 (51,335,049); Saskatchewan 95,999,116 (213,258,902); Alberta 58,218,808 (139,711,862) bushels. For the forty-four weeks ending June 5, 1942 and the same period in 1941 190,538,633 and 404,305,813 bushels were received from the farms.
