WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 12, 1942 decreased 2,561,530 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 58,161,562 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 410,895,748 bushels compared with 413,457,278 bushels for the previous week and 469,057,310 bushels for the week of June 13, 1941. The stocks of 410,895,748 bushels include 815,780 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending June 12, 1942 were 390,097,317 bushels compared with 392,537,789 bushels for the previous week and 429,137,014 bushels for the week ending June 13, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 141,140,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,278,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 16,934,670; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,718,680; Victoria 1,020,554; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 120,340,099; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 38,562,992 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 15,068,971 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 6,320,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 26,141; Vancouver-New Westminster 114,918 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,904,017 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Private and Mill of 4,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,038,852 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,213,996 bushels.

For the week ending June 12, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,501,218 bushels, and in transit by rail 25,708,856 compared with 3,733,037 in transit on the lakes and 23,455,588 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,798,431 bushels, a decrease of 121,058 bushels from the previous week when 20,919,489 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 6,606,000; Erie 2,133,000; Erie Canal Afloat 480,000; Portland 445,451; Boston 2,214,809; New York 2,640,000; New York Afloat 211,000; Philadelphia 344,342; Baltimore 1,423,150; Albany 157,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,143,679 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Erie Canal Afloat of 37,000; Portland 21,500; New York Afloat 440,000; Philadelphia 24,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 307,823 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 76,000; Boston 77,515; New York 267,000 and Baltimore 288,750 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,920,296 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 15,549,101; Erie 2,315,000; Erie Canal Afloat 591,000; Buffalo 6,224,000; Buffalo Afloat 388,000; Albany 2,794,000; New York 1,891,000; New York Afloat 1,117,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 468,279; Baltimore 866,833 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,210,879 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 12, 1942 amounted to 3,251,238 bushels, an increase of 1,062,996 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 2,188,242 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,825,790 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 12, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 776,950 (767,459); Saskatchewan 1,703,509 (5,413,525); Alberta 770,779 (2,644,806) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-five weeks from August 1, 1941 to June 12, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 37,099,417 (52,102,508); Saskatchewan 97,702,625 (218,672,427); Alberta 59,003,877 (142,356,668) bushels. For the forty-five weeks ending June 12, 1942 and the same period in 1941 193,805,919 and 413,131,603 bushels were received from the farms.
