WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 26, 1942 decreased 1,443,826 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 63,647,594 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 407,015,379 bushels compared with 408,459,205 bushels for the previous week and 470,662,973 bushels for the week of June 27, 1941. The stocks of 407,015,379 bushels include 789,494 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending June 26, 1942 were 386,575,624 bushels compared with 387,851,558 bushels for the previous week and 432,212,161 bushels for the week ending June 27, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 133,260,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,099,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 16,352,595; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,685,848; Victoria 1,020,554; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 124,553,585; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 40,807,638 and Eastern Elevators Scaboard Ports 17,631,932 bushels.

Increases were noted at Interior Private and Mill of 51,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,224,340; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 759,244 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,501,974 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 3,995,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 308,812 and Vancouver-New Westminster 18,237 bushels.

For the week ending June 26, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 1,371,516 bushels, and in transit by rail 23,969,679 compared with 5,884,583 in transit on the lakes and 23,429,936 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,439,755 bushels, a decrease of 167,892 bushels from the previous week when 20,607,647 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 6,433,000; Erie 2,133,000; Erie Canal Afloat 704,000; Portland 751,586; Boston 2,214,809; New York 1,636,000; New York Afloat 422,000; Philadelphia 344,342; Baltimore 1,537,200; Albany 83,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,180,818 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 486,000; Boston 88,000; Néw York 316,000 and Albany 26,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 138,000; Erie Canal Afloat 29,000; Portland 195,597; Baltimore 39,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 346,511 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 38,450,812 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 14,161,101; Erie 2,254,000; Erie Canal Afloat 225,000; Buffalo 5,564,000; Albany 2,770,000; New York 3,195,000; New York Afloat 830,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,249,100 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,225,128 bushels.

PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 26, 1942 amounted to 2,022,433 bushels, a decrease of 840,148 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 2,862,581 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 7,766,166 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 26, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 677,123 (1,085,660); Saskatchewan 710,323 (4,223,008); Alberta 634,987 (2,457,498) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-seven weeks from August 1, 1941 to June 26, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 38,538,683(54,025,066); Saskatchewan 100,003,082 (227,560,278); Alberta 60,151,569 (147,229,839) bushels. For the forty-seven weeks ending June 26, 1942 and the same period in 1941 198,693,334 and 428,815,183 bushels were received from the farms.


