WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 10, 1942 decreased 1,419,402 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 59,309,861 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 404,134,905 bushels compared with 405,554,307 bushels for the previous week and 463,444,766 bushels for the week of July 11, 1941. The stocks of 404,134,905 bushels include 782,014 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending July 10, 1942 were 383,661,921 bushels compared with 384,745,957 bushels for the previous week and 426,694,938 bushels for the week ending July 11, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 127,775,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,290,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 16,418,936; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,622,633; Victoria 842,887; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 126,536,117; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 39,353,152 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,905,137 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 1,470,000; Vancouver-New Westminster 41,363; Victoria 177,334 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,245,106 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Private and Mill of 114,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 103,035; Fort William and Port Arthur 637,963 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,077,403 bushels.

For the week ending July 10, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,003,987 bushels, and in transit by rail 22,090,795 compared with 2,911,483 in transit on the lakes and 23,299,950 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,472,984 bushels, a decrease of 335,366 bushels from the previous week when 20,808,350 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,975,000; Erie 2,194,000; Erie Canal Afloat 230,000; Portland 1,037,549; Boston 2,267,386; New York 1,809,000; New York Afloat 483,000; Philadelphia 344,342; Baltimore 1,812,644; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,135,063 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Erie of 116,000; Boston 108,000; New York 154,000 and New York Afloat 354,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 21,000; Portland 89,681; Baltimore 275,444 and In Transit U.S.A. 10,509 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 36,749,828 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 13,039,101; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 400,000; Buffalo 5,280,000; Buffalo Afloat 361,981; Albany 2,770,000; New York 2,673,000; New York Afloat 1,173,000; Boston 2,349,120; Portland 1,156,084; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 678,891 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,153,372 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 10, 1942 amounted to 3,450,606 bushels, an increase of 1,295,363 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 2,155,243 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 3,150,841 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 10, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 441,672 (474,212); Saskatchewan 2,040,622 (1,691,736); Alberta 968,312 (984,893) bushels.


Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the forty-nine weeks from August 1, 1941 to July 10, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941; Manitoba 39,561,202 (55,349,735); Saskatchewan 103,045,192 (231,628,754); Alberta 61,692,959 (150,010,474) bushels. For the forty-nine weeks ending July 10, 1942 and the same period in 1941 204,299,353 and 436,988,963 bushels were received from the farms.






