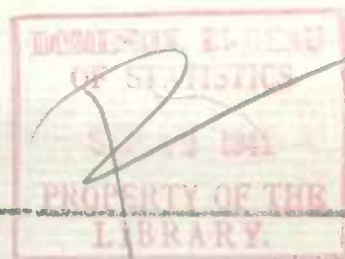

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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 5, 1941 increased 4,587,689 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 154,173,273 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 470,737,304 bushels compared with 466,149,615 bushels for the previous week and 316,564,031 bushels for the week of September 6, 1940. The stocks of 470,737,304 bushels include 1,808,731 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 5, 1941 were 444,449,911 bushels compared with 438,088,494 bushels for the previous week and 283,388,592 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 211,315,000; Interior Terminals 26,340,013; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,870,075; Victoria 1,025,405; Prince Rupert 1,205,961; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 96,390,800; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,236,433 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 25,601,488 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 965,000; Victoria 39,503; Vancouver-New Westminster 9,158; Fort William and Port Arthur 3,861,325; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,696,025 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,196,158 bushels, while decreases were shown at Interior Terminals of 86,561 and Prince Rupert 2,014 bushels.

For the week ending September 5, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 3,374,650 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,472,690 compared with 3,497,266 in transit on the lakes and 14,510,369 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940;

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,287,393 bushels, a decrease of 1,773,728 bushels from the previous week when 28,061,121 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 4,425,399; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 486,000; Buffalo 4,655,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,281,000; New York Afloat 875,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 964,748 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,412,678 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 1,778,804; Buffalo 397,000 and Buffalo Afloat 219,000 bushels, while increases were noted at New York of 34,000; New York Afloat 59,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 528,076 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 33,175,439 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 3,558,039; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,422,000; Chicago 36,000; Buffalo 6,319,000; Buffalo Afloat 618,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,592,000; New York 1,488,000; New York Afloat 358,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,399,042 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 5, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,460,706 bushels. This compared with 2,457,281 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to September 5, 1941 was 12,863,368 bushels compared with 9,832,167 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 5, 1941 amounted to 6,399,564 bushels, a decrease of 1,872,993 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 8,272,557 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 16,924,081 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 5, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,254,698 (2,050,292); Saskatchewan 4,022,305 (11,063,850); Alberta 1,122,561 (3,809,939) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the five weeks from August 1, 1941 to September 5, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 6,035,426 (10,075,675); Saskatchewan 13,541,758 (29,129,322); Alberta 5,881,969 (10,473,700) bushels. For the five weeks ending September 5, 1941 and the same period in 1940 25,459,153 and 49,678,697 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending September 6, 1941 amounted to 5,778,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,531,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,024,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed an increase from the previous week of 170,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were higher by 77,000 bushels.

During the first five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 30,201,000 bushels as compared with 27,984,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 21,476,000 bushels as compared with 15,576,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 8,725,000 bushels during the first five weeks of the present crop year as compared with 11,488,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first four weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 6 million bushels as compared with 5.6 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.3 million bushels as compared with 3.1 million bushels for the same weeks last year.
