WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 31, 1942 increased 3,439,075 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 53,204,162 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 410,633,920 bushels compared with 407,194,845 bushels for the previous week and 463,838,082 bushels for the week of August 1, 1941. The stocks of 410,633,920 bushels include 817,487 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending July 31, 1942 were 390,572,438 bushels compared with 387,491,643 bushels for the previous week and 432,503,783 bushels for the week ending August 1, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 132,930,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,148,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 18,238,157; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,904,462; Victoria 845,604; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 127,847,631; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,185,233 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,204,700 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,180,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 787,772; Vancouver-New Westminster 96,204; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,579,905 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 234,966 bushels, while decreases were noted at Interior Private and Mill of 137,000 and Fort William and Port Arthur 350,261 bushels.

For the week ending July 31, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,023,439 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,421,935 compared with 3,253,949 in transit on the lakes and 21,351,509 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

Stocks of Ontario Grain: According to the Eastern Elevators, the following quantities of Ontario wheat, oats, barley, buckwheat and corn are in the undermentioned ports: (in bushels)



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,061,482 bushels, an increase of 358,280 bushels over the previous week when 19,703,202 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,874,000; Buffalo Afloat 298,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,127,428; Boston 2,324,443; New York 1,977,000; New York Afloat 337,000; Philadelphia 344,834; Baltimore 1,783,792; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,636,985 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 288,000; Buffalo Afloat 298,000; Portland 122,458; Boston 168,060 and Philadelphia 284,862 bushels, while decreases were shown at New York of 51,000; New York Afloat 8,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 744,100 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,334,299 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 10,933,601; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 600,000; Buffalo 5,331,064; Albany 2,826,051; New York 3,051,454; New York Afloat 602,880; Boston 2,128,920; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 685,743 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,163,263 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 31, 1942 amounted to 7,976,352 bushels, an increase of 2,283,911 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 5,692,441 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,118,681 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 31, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 760,015 (630,275); Saskatchewan 4,218,816 (4,105,222); Alberta 3,087,521 (3,383,184) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the fifty-two weeks from August 1, 1941 to July 31, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 41,317,954 (57,394,249); Saskatchewan 113,485,805 (242,345,995); Alberta 68,057,229 (158,642,367) bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 31, 1942 and the same period in 1941, 222,860,988 and 458,382,611 bushels were received from the farms.




