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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 12, 1941 increased 322,364 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 139,411,747 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 471,277,749 bushels compared with 470,955,385 bushels for the previous week and 331,866,002 bushels for the week of September 13, 1940. The stocks of 471,277,749 bushels include 1,530,384 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 12, 1941 were 445,318,591 bushels compared with 444,578,992 bushels for the previous week and 296,365,669 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 208,770,000; Interior Terminals 26,337,562; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,924,968; Victoria 1,024,405; Prince Rupert 1,205,961; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 97,982,215; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,100,148 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 27,467,157 bushels.

Increases were noted at Vancouver-New Westminster of 54,893; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,591,415 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,865,669 bushels, while decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,545,000; Interior Terminals 2,451; Victoria 1,000 and Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 136,285 bushels.

For the week ending September 12, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,967,900 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,920,879 compared with 2,961,321 in transit on the lakes and 15,807,649 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,959,158 bushels, a decrease of 328,235 bushels from the previous week when 26,287,393 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 3,553,399; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 214,000; Buffalo 4,458,000; Buffalo Afloat 533,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,556,000; New York Afloat 1,439,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,014,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,003,588 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 872,000; Erie Canal Afloat 272,000; Buffalo 197,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 409,090 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 533,000; New York 275,000; New York Afloat 564,000 and Baltimore 49,855 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 35,500,333 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 5,696,253; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal Afloat 1,718,000; Chicago 36,000; Buffalo 6,765,000; Buffalo Afloat 165,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,737,000; New York 2,026,000; New York Afloat 396,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,075,722 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 12, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,432,489 bushels. This compared with 895,149 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to September 12, 1941 was 15,295,857 bushels compared with 10,727,316 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 12, 1941 amounted to 5,722,447 bushels, a decrease of 714,548 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 6,437,995 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 16,573,954 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 12, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940; Manitoba 381,573 (3,054,529); Saskatchewan 4,143,005 (11,806,253); Alberta 1,197,869 (1,713,172) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the six weeks from August 1, 1941 to September 12, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 6,422,622 (13,130,204); Saskatchewan 17,684,763 (40,935,575); Alberta 7,112,646 (12,186,872) bushels. For the six weeks ending September 12, 1941 and the same period in 1940 31,220,031 and 66,252,651 bushels were received from the farms.

World shipments for the week ending September 13, 1941 amounted to 4,648,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 5,778,000 bushels for the previous week and 4,888,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease from the previous week of 877,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were lower by 253,000 bushels.

During the first six weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 34,849,000 bushels as compared with 32,872,000 bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were 24,974,000 bushels as compared with 18,240,000 bushels for the same period in 1940. Argentine shipments amounted to 9,875,000 bushels during the first six weeks of the present crop year as compared with 13,448,000 bushels for the same period in 1940.

WEEKLY AVERAGE SHIPMENTS

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first six weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1940.

According to the above table weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 5.8 million bushels as compared with 5.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1940. North American weekly average shipments were 4.2 million bushels as compared with 3.0 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

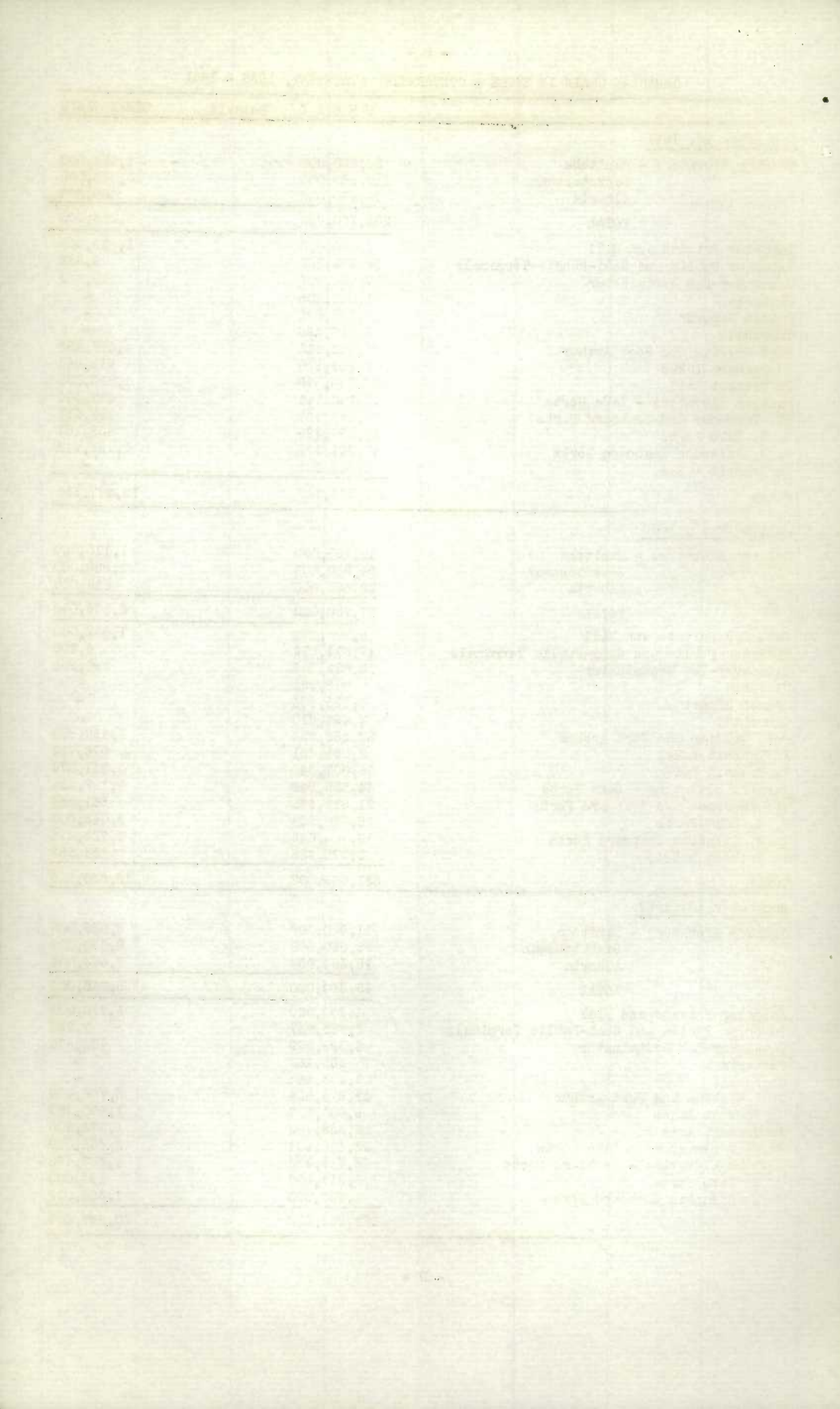
