WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 19, 1941 increased 1,589,143 bushels as compared with the previous week and increased 114,970,855 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1940. The amount in store was reported as 472,866,892 bushels compared with 471,277,749 bushels for the previous week and 357,896,037 bushels for the week of September 20, 1940. The stocks of 472,866,892 bushels include 1,353,776 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators in Canada for the week ending September 19, 1941 were 447,519,266 bushels compared with 445,318,591 bushels for the previous week and 321,704,823 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 208,990,000; Interior Terminals 26,548,824; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,988,575; Victoria 1,025,217; Prince Rupert 1,205,961; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 100,128,918; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 43,262,212 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 27,502,294 bushels.

Increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 220,000; Interior Terminals 211,262; Vancouver-New Westminster 63,607; Victoria 812; Fort William and Port Arthur 2,146,703; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 1,162,064 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 35,137 bushels.

For the week ending September 19, 1941 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,971,321 bushels, and in transit by rail 15,278,548 compared with 3,847,834 in transit on the lakes and 19,066,051 in transit by rail for the corresponding period in 1940.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,347,626 bushels, a decrease of 611,532 bushels from the previous week when 25,929,158 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Duluth 2,681,399; Erie 2,193,000; Erie Canal Afloat 337,000; Buffalo 4,156,000; Buffalo Afloat 187,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,482,000; New York Afloat 1,611,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,014,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,731,056 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Duluth of 872,000; Erie 40,000; Buffalo 302,000; Buffalo Afloat 346,000 and New York 74,000 bushels, while increases were noted at Erie Canal Afloat of 123,000; New York Afloat 172,000 and in Transit U.S.A. 727,468 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 36,191,214 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 6,341,652; Erie 1,956,000; Erie Canal Afloat 548,000; Chicago 29,000; Buffalo 6,670,000; Buffalo Afloat 315,000; Ogdensburg 384,315; Albany 8,896,000; New York 2,608,000; New York Afloat 675,000; Boston 2,231,999; Portland 1,211,145; Philadelphia 1,017,522; Baltimore 1,084,377 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,223,204 bushels.





EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 19, 1941 the export clearances overseas of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,913,816 bushels. This compared with 1,532,713 bushels for the corresponding week in 1940. The accumulated total for the period from August 1, 1941 to September 19, 1941 was 18,209,673 bushels compared with 12,260,029 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 19, 1941 amounted to 7,895,524 bushels, an increase of 2,150,077 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 5,745,447 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 29,108,104 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 19, 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 1,044,927 (5,635,042); Saskatchewan 5,446,304 (17,727,231); Alberta 1,404,293 (5,745,831) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seven weeks from August 1, 1941 to September 19, 1941 as compared with the same period in 1940 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1940: Manitoba 7,467,549 (18,765,246); Saskatchewan 23,131,067 (58,662,806); Alberta 8,539,939 (17,932,703) bushels. For the seven weeks ending September 19, 1941 and the same period in 1940 39,138,555 and 95,360,755 bushels were received from the farms.
