WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 7, 1942 increased 851,633 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 52,711,604 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 411,485,553 bushels compared with 410,633,920 bushels for the previous week and 464,197,157 bushels for the week of August 8, 1941. The stocks of 411,485,553 bushels include 810,676 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending August 7, 1942 were 391,129,957 bushels compared with 390,572,438 bushels for the previous week and 432,749,672 bushels for the week ending August 8, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 133,175,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,013,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 18,567,840; Vancouver-New Westminster 16,948,594; Victoria 905,669; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 128,304,350; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,242,814 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 23,367,040 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 245,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 329,683; Vancouver-New Westminster 44,132; Victoria 60,065; Fort William and Port Arthur 456,719; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 57,531 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 162,340 bushels, while Interior Private and Mill decreased 135,000 bushels.

For the week ending August 7, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 1,081,866 bushels, and in transit by rail 16,700,507 compared with 1,916,122 in transit on the lakes and 23,437,290 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,355,596 bushels, an increase of 294,114 bushels over the previous week when 20,061,482 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,974,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,212,979; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,939,000; New York Afloat 337,000; Philadelphia 344,334; Baltimore 1,710,519; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,104,863 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 100,000; Portland 85,551; Boston 49,958 and In Transit U.S.A. 467,378 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo Afloat of 298,000, New York 38,000 and Baltimore 73,273 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,447,485 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 10,401,232; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 766,000; Buffalo 5,206,000; Buffalo Afloat 81,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,067,000; New York Afloat 706,000; Boston 1,836,564; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 929,328 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,567,238 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 7, 1942 amounted to 400,826 bushels a decrease of 9,298,607 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 9,699,433 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 894,869 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 7, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 59,543 (233,953); Saskatchewan 252,873 (185,573); Alberta 86,410 (475,343) bushels.


