WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 14, 1942 decreased 5,096,683 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 56,619,435 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 406,388,870 bushels compared with 411,485,553 bushels for the previous week and 463,008,305 bushels for the week of August 15, 1941. The stocks of 406,388,870 bushels include 717,156 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending August 14, 1942 were 385,224,824 bushels compared with 391,129,957 bushels for the previous week and 431,529,744 bushels for the week ending August 15, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 130,000,000; Interior Private and Mill 5,857,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,031,798; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,108,196; Victoria 924,295; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchhill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 128,733,151; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 42,177,660 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,344,303 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 3,175,000; Interior Private and Mill 156,000; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 65,154 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,022,737 bushels, while increases were noted at Interior Public and Semi-Public of 463,958; Vancouver-New Westminster 159,602; Victoria 18,626 and Fort William and Port Arthur 428,801 bushels.

For the week ending August 14, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 1,160,364 bushels, and in transit by rail 14,064,780 compared with 3,341,380 in transit on the lakes and 23,582,246 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,164,046 bushels, an increase of 808,450 bushels over the previous week when 20,355,596 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 6,234,000; Buffalo Afloat 356,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,236,876; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,923,000; New York Afloat 337,000; Philadelphia 344,834; Baltimore 1,923,927; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,076,008 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo of 260,000; Buffalo Afloat 356,000; Portland 23,897 and Baltimore 213,408 bushels, while New York and In Transit U.S.A. decreased 16,000 and 28,855 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,478,561 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 9,598,732; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 436,000; Buffalo 5,231,000; Buffalo Afloat 302,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,060,000; New York Afloat 754,000; Boston 1,886,364; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 964,753 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,408,389 bushels.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE LAND OFFICE
IN RESPONSE TO A RESOLUTION PASSED BY THE SENATE
MAY 15, 1906.

THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE LAND OFFICE have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of a resolution of the Senate, passed May 15, 1906, relative to the report of the Commission on the Land Office, and in response to the same to submit herewith a report on the subject.

The report of the Commission on the Land Office, which was submitted to the Senate on May 15, 1906, contains a full and complete statement of the condition of the land office at that time, and of the measures which have since been taken to improve its management. It is believed that the measures taken since that time have been such as to bring the land office into a more efficient and economical condition than it was in at that time.

PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Only 10,379 bushels of wheat were received from farms in the Prairie Provinces during the week ending August 14, compared with the revised total of only 485 bushels in the week ending August 7. Marketings for the first week of the crop year had previously been reported at 400,326 bushels but the Board of Grain Commissioners advise that old crop wheat had been erroneously reported as new business and the figures have been revised accordingly.

During the second week of August last year, a total of 3,625,532 bushels of wheat was delivered from western farms and the following are the receipts in the week ending August 14 this year with figures for 1941 in brackets: Manitoba 8,630 (1,050,592); Saskatchewan 1,749 (1,625,647); Alberta nil (941,293) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the two weeks from August 1, 1942 to August 14, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 8,975 (1,292,545); Saskatchewan 1,889 (1,811,220); Alberta nil (1,416,636) bushels. For the two weeks ending August 14, 1942 and the same period in 1941, 10,364 and 4,520,401 bushels were received from the farms.


