WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 28, 1942 decreased 3,994,407 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 67,747,089 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 398,402,526 bushels compared with 402,396,933 bushels for the previous week and 466,149,615 bushels for the week of August 29, 1941. The stocks of 398,402,526 bushels include 699,890 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending August 28, 1942 were 378,090,875 bushels compared with 381,946,750 bushels for the previous week and 438,088,494 bushels for the week ending August 29, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 125,860,000; Interior Private and Mill 5,362,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,381,053; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,276,287; Victoria 968,016; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 130,509,831; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 40,570,637 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 20,538,740 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 1,855,000; Fort William and Port Arthur 15,497; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 807,038 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 1,439,065 bushels, while increases were shown at Interior Private and mill of 90,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 116,206; Vancouver and New Westminster 115,515 and Victoria 43,721 bushels.

For the week ending August 28, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 708,828 bushels, and in transit by rail 12,592,206 compared with 4,233,121 in transit on the lakes and 16,931,396 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,311,651 bushels, a decrease of 138,532 bushels from the previous week when 20,450,183 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 6,523,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,194,381; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,886,000; New York Afloat 318,000; Philadelphia 344,834; Baltimore 1,836,099; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,476,936 bushels.

Decreases were shown at New York of 37,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 353,156 bushels, while increases were noted at Buffalo of 49,000 and Baltimore 202,624 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 28,061,121 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 6,204,203; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 486,000; Buffalo 5,052,000; Buffalo Afloat 219,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,247,000; New York Afloat 816,000; Boston 2,358,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 964,748 and In Transit U.S.A. 1,884,602 bushels.

PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 28, 1942 amounted to 1,564,942 bushels, an increase of 1,212,419 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 352,523 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,272,557 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 28, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 455,543 (1,902,244); Saskatchewan 419,809 (4,532,417); Alberta 689,590 (1,837,896) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the four weeks from August 1, 1942 to August 28, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 502,516 (4,780,728); Saskatchewan 450,967 (9,519,453); Alberta 975,050 (4,759,408) bushels. For the four weeks ending August 28, 1942 and the same period in 1941, 1,928,533 and 19,059,589 bushels were received from the farms.




