WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 11, 1942 increased 2,846,109 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 71,410,019 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 399,769,606 bushels compared with 396,923,497 bushels for the previous week and 471,179,625 bushels for the week of September 12, 1941. The stocks of 399,769,606 bushels include 710,054 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending September 11, 1942 were 379,442,483 bushels compared with 376,708,639 bushels for the previous week and 445,220,467 bushels for the week ending September 12, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 125,650,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,239,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,518,302; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,359,417; Victoria 1,005,789; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 129,647,542; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 40,978,941 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,496,388 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 2,025,000; Interior Private and Mill 111,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 67,127; Vancouver-New Westminster 42,820; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 661,849 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 561,083 bushels, while decreases were noted at Victoria of 2,833 and Fort William and Port Arthur 319,069 bushels.

For the week ending September 11, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,042,634 bushels, and in transit by rail 11,681,193 compared with 2,967,900 in transit on the lakes and 16,920,879 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,327,123 bushels, an increase of 112,265 bushels over the previous week when 20,214,858 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,973,000; Buffalo Afloat 317,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,252,941; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,725,000; New York Afloat 175,000; Philadelphia 344,834; Baltimore 2,165,176; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,641,771 bushels.

Increases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 317,000; Portland 44,200; Baltimore 164,007 and In Transit U.S.A. 53,058 bushels, while decreases were shown at Buffalo of 325,000 and New York 141,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,959,158 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 3,553,399; Erie 2,233,000; Erie Canal Afloat 214,000; Buffalo 4,458,000; Buffalo Afloat 533,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,556,000; New York Afloat 1,439,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,014,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,003,588 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 11, 1942 amounted to 4,839,470 bushels, an increase of 3,180,476 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 1,658,994 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,745,447 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 11, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 1,494,364 (381,573); Saskatchewan 2,561,064 (4,143,005); Alberta 784,042 (1,220,869) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the six weeks from August 1, 1942 to September 11, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 2,354,213 (6,422,622); Saskatchewan 3,609,575 (17,684,763); Alberta 2,508,039 (7,135,646) bushels. For the six weeks ending September 11, 1942 and the same period in 1941, 8,471,827 and 31,243,031 bushels were received from the farms.


