

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 18, 1942 increased 6,549,592 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 66,547,694 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 406,319,198 bushels compared with 399,769,606 bushels for the previous week and 472,866,892 bushels for the week of September 19, 1941. The stocks of 406,319,198 bushels include 797,503 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending September 18, 1942 were 386,390,204 bushels compared with 379,442,483 bushels for the previous week and 447,519,266 bushels for the week ending September 19, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 133,255,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,408,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,645,577; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,343,664; Victoria 1,005,789; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 130,039,589; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 41,022,257 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 21,903,495 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 7,605,000; Interior Private and Mill 169,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 127,275; Fort William and Port Arthur 392,047; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 43,316 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 407,107 bushels, while Vancouver-New Westminster decreased 15,753 bushels.

For the week ending September 18, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 1,375,458 bushels and in transit by rail 10,568,098 compared with 2,971,321 in transit on the lakes and 15,278,548 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.



CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,928,994 bushels, a decrease of 398,129 bushels from the previous week when 20,327,123 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,355,000; Buffalo Afloat 136,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,252,375; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,876,000; New York Afloat 175,000; Philadelphia 314,834; Baltimore 1,523,094; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,534,290 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo of 618,000; Buffalo Afloat 181,000; Portland 566 and Baltimore 642,082 bushels, while increases were shown at Boston of 151,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 892,519 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,347,626 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 2,681,399; Erie 2,193,000; Eric Canal Afloat 337,000; Buffalo 4,156,000; Buffalo Afloat 187,000; Albany 2,826,000; New York 3,482,000; New York Afloat 1,611,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,014,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 2,731,056 bushels.



PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators
and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 18, 1942 amounted to 10,620,246 bushels, an increase of 5,772,878 bushels over the revised figures of the previous week when 4,847,368 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,176,398 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 18, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 2,309,561 (1,071,540); Saskatchewan 6,928,526 (5,530,119); Alberta 1,382,159 (1,574,739) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the seven weeks from August 1, 1942 to September 18, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 4,669,868 (7,494,162); Saskatchewan 10,538,101 (23,214,882); Alberta 3,692,002 (8,710,385) bushels. For the seven weeks ending September 18, 1942 and the same period in 1941 19,099,971 and 39,419,429 bushels were received from the farms.


