#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 24, 1942 increased 592,947 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 67,316,196 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 406,912,145 bushels compared with 406,319,198 bushels for the previous week and 474,228 341 bushels for the week of September 26, 1941. The stocks of 406,912,145 bushels include 798,455 bushels of Durum wheat.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending September 24, 1942 were 387,147,701 bushels compared with 386,390,204 bushels for the previous week and 448,899,328 bushels for the week ending September 26, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 134,555,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,528,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,682,200; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,363,840; Victoria 1,005,789; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 129,002,285; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 41,299,640 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,205,190 bushels.

Increases were shown at Western Country Elevators of 1,300,000; Interior Private and Mill 120,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 36,623; Vancouver-New Westminster 20,176; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 277,383 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 301,695 bushels, while Fort William and Port Arthur decreased 1,037,304 bushels.

For the week ending September 24, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 1,843,948 bushels, and in transit by rail 9,838,532 compared with 2,738,847 in transit on the lakes and 16,539,803 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

#### CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,764,444 bushels, a decrease of 164,550 bushels from the previous week when 19,928,994 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,743,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,261,966; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,972,000; New York Afloat 59,000; Philadelphia 344,834; Baltimore 1,523,094; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 4,128,149 bushels.

Decreases were noted at Buffalo Afloat of 136,000; New York Afloat 116,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 406,141 bushels, while increases were shown at Buffalo of 388,000; Portland 9,591 and New York 96,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,328,513 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,750,043; Erie 2,193,000; Erie Canal Afloat 416,000; Buffalo 4,353,000; Buffalo Afloat 75,000; Albany 2,719,000; New York 3,612,000; New York Afloat 1,501,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,279; Baltimore 1,014,603 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,566,299 bushels.

#### PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 24, 1942 amounted to 4,069,270 bushels, a decrease of 6,615,859 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 10,685,129 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 7,590,185 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 24, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 768,881 (1,291,556); Saskatchewan 2,546,141 (4,901,461); Alberta 754,248 (1,397,168) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the eight weeks from August 1, 1942 to September 24, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 5,458,570 (8,785,718); Saskatchewan 13,090,733 (28,116,343); Alberta 4,684,821 (10,107,553) bushels. For the eight weeks ending September 24, 1942 and the same period in 1941 23,234,124 and 47,009,614 bushels were received from the farms.


