WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 1, 1942 decreased 604,719 bushels as compared with the previous week and decreased 70,534,886 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1941. The amount in store was reported as 406,307,426 bushels compared with 406,912,145 bushels for the previous week and 476,842,312 bushels for the week of October 2, 1941. The stocks of 406,307,426 bushels include 798,016 bushels of Durum wheat.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN CANADA

The wheat stocks in elevators and in transit in Canada for the week ending October 1, 1942 were 386,955,782 bushels compared with 387,147,701 bushels for the previous week and 452,018,107 bushels for the week ending October 2, 1941.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian elevators were located as follows: Western Country Elevators 135,985,000; Interior Private and Mill 6,593,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 19,706,763; Vancouver-New Westminster 17,349,323; Victoria 1,005,789; Prince Rupert 1,205,881; Churchill 2,617,396; Fort William and Port Arthur 127,205,846; Eastern Elevators Lake Ports 40,574,986 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 22,530,500 bushels.

Decreases were shown at Vancouver-New Westminster of 14,517; Fort William and Port Arthur 1,796,439 and Eastern Elevator Lake Ports 724,654 bushels, while increases were noted at Western Country Elevators of 1,430,000; Interior Private and Mill 65,000; Interior Public and Semi-Public 24,563 and Eastern Elevators Seaboard Ports 325,310 bushels.

For the week ending October 1, 1942 the amount of wheat in transit on the lakes was 2,730,606 bushels, and in transit by rail 9,450,692 compared with 1,609,301 in transit on the lakes and 20,548,208 in transit by rail for the corresponding week in 1941.

CANADIAN WHEAT IN THE UNITED STATES

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,351,644 bushels, a decrease of 412,800 bushels from the previous week when 19,764,444 bushels were reported. This Canadian wheat was located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,766,000; Erie 2,173,000; Portland 1,286,430; Boston 2,374,401; New York 1,916,000; New York Afloat 59,000; Philadelphia 344,334; Baltimore 1,710,696; Albany 185,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,536,283 bushels.

Decreases were noted at New York of 56,000 and In Transit U.S.A. 591,866 bushels, while increases were shown at Buffalo of 23,000; Portland 24,464 and Baltimore 187,602 bushels.

For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,824,205 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,327,001; Erie 2,193,000; Erie Canal Afloat 316,000; Buffalo 4,276,000; Albany 2,683,000; New York 3,811,000; New York Afloat 1,783,000; Boston 2,350,245; Portland 1,306,044; Philadelphia 472,281; Baltimore 995,936 and In Transit U.S.A. 3,310,698 bushels.

PRIMARY MARKETINGS

Farmers' deliveries to Country Elevators, Interior Private and Mill Elevators and Loadings over Platforms

Wheat receipts in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 1, 1942 amounted to 3,320,362 bushels, a decrease of 879,361 bushels from the revised figures of the previous week when 4,199,723 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,100,344 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 1, 1942 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 526,516 (705,887); Saskatchewan 1,832,893 (4,013,644); Alberta 960,953 (1,380,813) bushels.

Marketings in the three Prairie Provinces for the nine weeks from August 1, 1942 to October 1, 1942 as compared with the same period in 1941 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1941: Manitoba 5,996,386 (9,491,605); Saskatchewan 14,926,720 (32,129,987); Alberta 6,761,834 (11,488,366) bushels. For the nine weeks ending October 1, 1942 and the same period in 1941, 26,684,939 and 53,109,958 bushels were received from the farms.

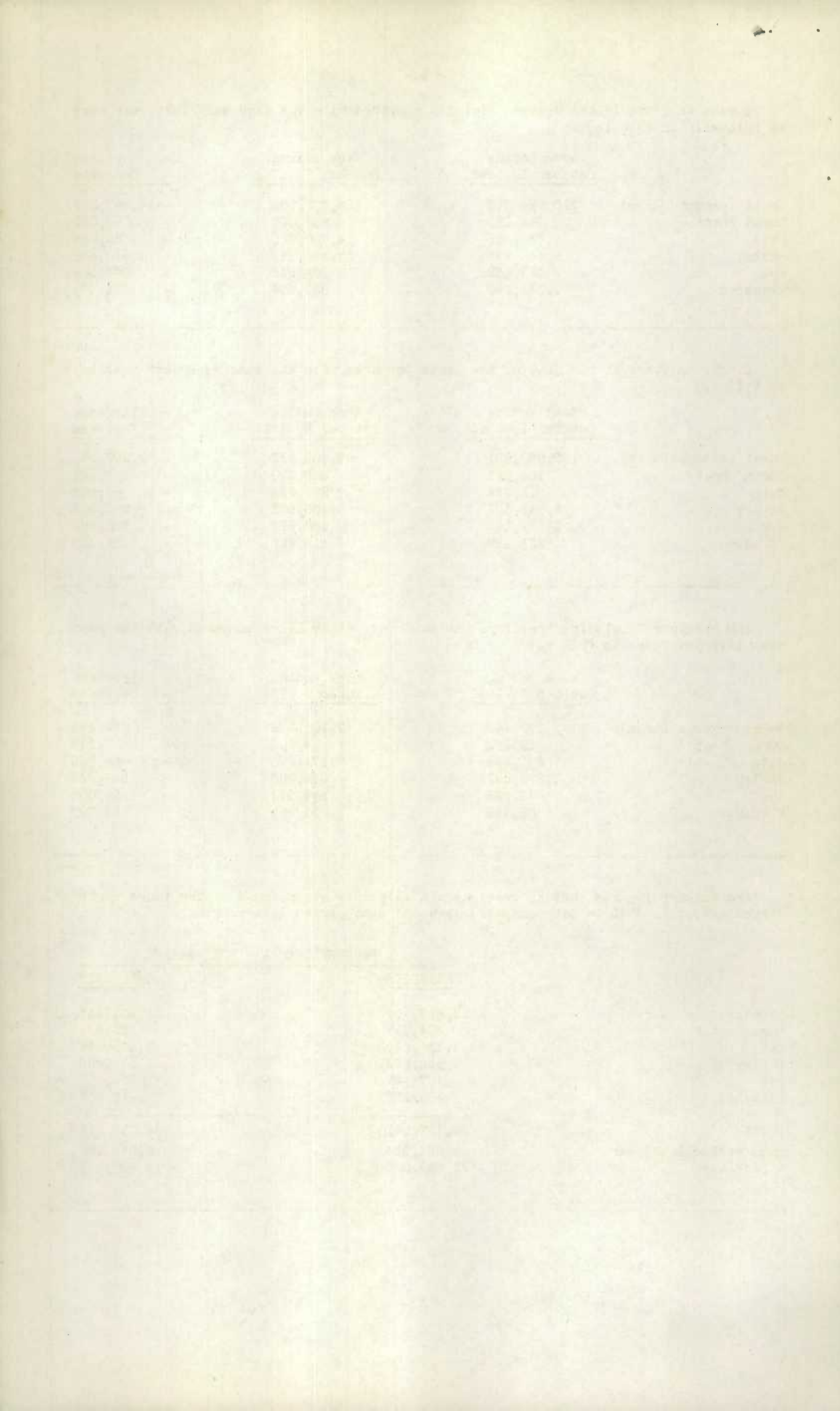

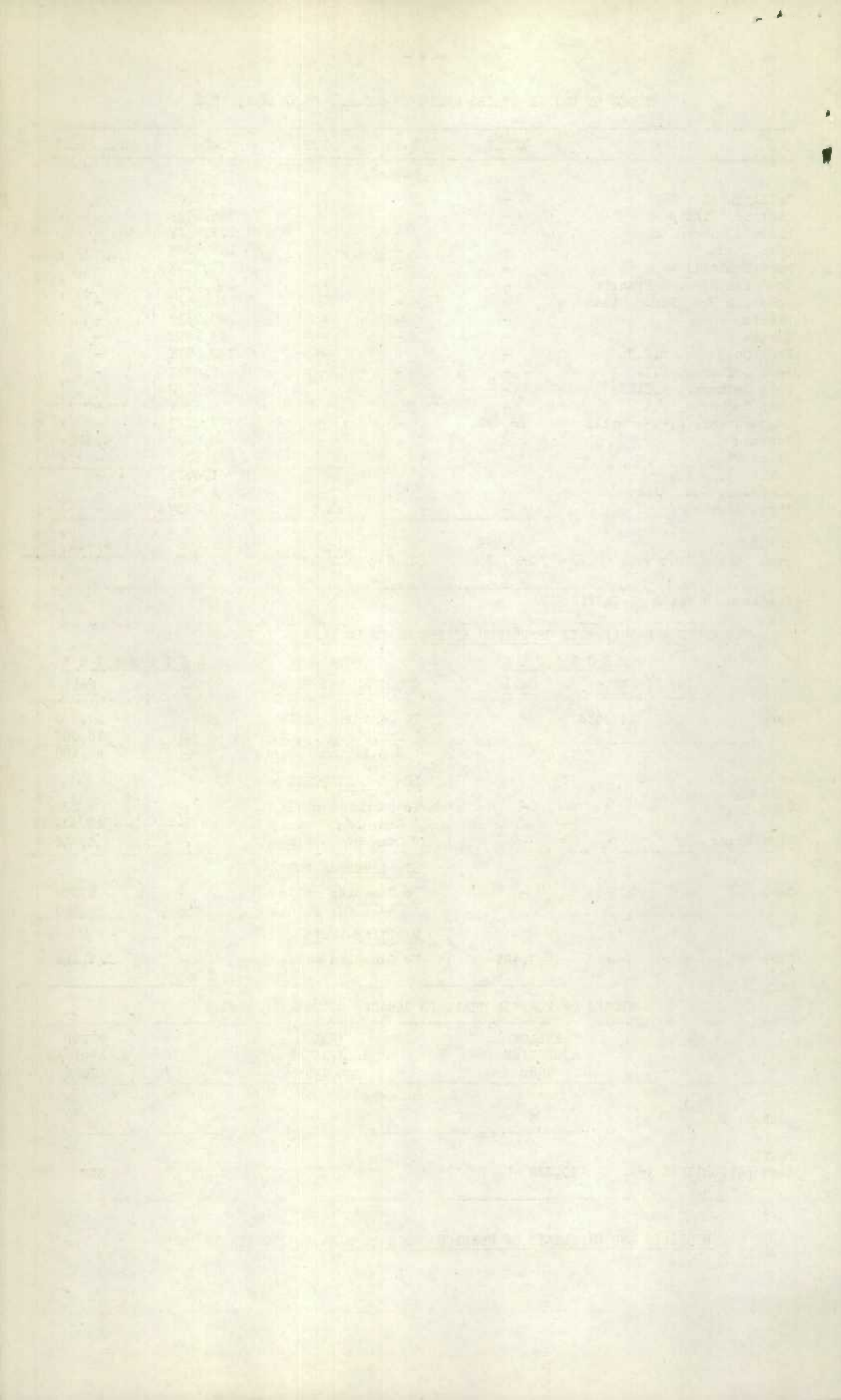
