

Effective for the period July 1, 1947 to June 30, 1948, Ontario Winter Wheat producers are to receive, in addition to the local market price, an additional eight cents per bushel. This additional amount is paid in respect of equalization fees which will continue to be collected on exports of Ontario winter wheat flour. In order to reduce administrative costs and to give a measure of certainty to producers, equalization payment to producers has been fixed at the definite figure of eight cents per bushel, which is in line with the estimated total receipts from equalization fees during the year.


