## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 22nd, 1922.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended September 22nd, 1922, the quantity of grain in store shows a net increase of 10,806,546 bushels. From the figures sent in all elevators report show increases in wheat of 9,575,015 bushels; Oats, 161,399 bushels; Barley, 853,295 bushels and Rye, 225,883 bushels. One small decrease took place in flax of 9,046 bushels.

In the Western Country Elevators, grain in store has increased in all grains over the previous week and are as follows:- Wheat, 3,993,849 bushels; Oats, 158,965 bushels; Barley, 251,843 bushels; Flax, 4,532 bushels and Rye, 12,798 bushels. Making a net total increase of 4,401,987 bushels. For details of the receipts, shipments and in store by provinces see page 8 of the attached. The following quantities of the different kinds of grain were in store on September 15th, according to the different prairie provinces, Western Ontario, British Columbia and Western Ontario:-

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS - Wheat shows an increase of 73,684 bushels and Rye, 8,110 bushels. Oats and barley show small decreases of 6,792 bushels and 4,830 bushels respectively. For details of the amounts held by the respective elevators together with their receipts and shipments see page 9 of the attached.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS, FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR - The grain in Store shows a net increase of 5,332,664 bushels. All grains show increases with the exception of Flax which shows a decrease of 7,578 bushels. The increases took place in wheat of 4,372,598 bushels; Oats, 64,669 bushels; Barley, 546,934 bushels and rye, 356,041 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS, Wheat, Oats and barley show increases of 2,173 bushels; Oats, 4,311 bushels and barley 143 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - Wheat shows an increase of 1,036,264 bushels; Barley, 35,173 bushels. Decreases are noted in oats of 58,470 bushels; Flax, 6,000 bushels and Rye 125,066 bushels. A net increase of 881,901 bushels. The total receipts of all grains at the above elevators were 4,764,977 bushels by vessel and 1,294,768 bushels by rail. The shipments being 3,047,420 bushels by vessel and 2,322,789 bushels by rail.



THE U.S. GRAIN IN STORE in the Public Elevators in the East is 10,330,689 bushels compared with 12,505,431 bushels for same week last year. Rye being accountable for the largest part of the former viz 4,222,303 bushels. Wheat is next and amounts to 3,680,293 bushels, corn, 2,242,978 bushels and oats, 1,85,115 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS (Buffalo & Duluth) show increases in wheat of 97,282 bushels and Barley, 7,461 bushels making a net increase of 104,743 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS, Grain in these parts show a net increase of 8,452 bushels. There being only one increase of 36,571 bushels in barley and decreases in wheat of 835 bushels; Oats, 1,284 bushels and Rye 26,000 bushels.
