## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 6th, 1923.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 6th, 1923, the quantity of grain in store had decreased in wheat by 1,639,812 bushels; barley, 226,854 bushels, flax, 31,752 bushels, while oats and rye show increases of 435,303 bushels and 279,951 bushels respectively.

IN THE WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS Decreases are shown in all grains - wheat 772,209 bushels, oats 330,728 bushels, barley 135,829 bushels; flax 40,707, bushels and rye 92,165 bushels. For details of the movement of grain by Provinces see Page 8, of the attached. THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS Show increases increase of 60,518 bushels in Rye of 7,736 bushels, while oats indicates a decrease of 19,238 bushels and barley 5,737 bushels. For details of the movement of grain by provinces see Page 9 of the attached.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS: FT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR - Increases are shown in wheat of 174,266 bushels; oats 338,999 bushels; barley 178,855 bushels and rye 19,444 bushels. Flax indicates a decrease of 21,570 bushels. THE TOTAL RECEIPTS AT FT. WILLIAM, PT. ARTHUR AND VANCOUVER FOR THE PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 1st, 1923, to date were as follows:-

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS Show decreases in oats of 3,811 bushels and barley 81 bushels, while wheat and rye indicate increases of 4,839 and 20,934 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST Show decreases in wheat 71,020,231 bushels and barley 35,032 bushels. Increases are indicated in Oats of 389,448 bushels, flax 30,525 bushels and rye 135,117 bushels. The receipts of all grains



were 5,098,299 bushels by vessel and 686,137 bushels by rail while the shipments were 4,372,482 bushels by vessel 1,653,716 bushels by rail, 211,295 bushels to mill and 63,000 bushels local shipments.

THE QUANTITY OF U.S. GRAIN IN STORE AT THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST WAS 3,235,128 bushels compared with 5,518,347 bushels last year. The bulk of the former was made up of rye and wheat viz 1,507,921 and 1,152,038 bushels respectively.

U.S. LAKE PORTS show decreases in wheat off 150,002 bushels, barley 100,791 bushels. Oats indicates an increase of 60,633 bushels.

IN THE U. S. RAILROAD STANDARD PORTS Increases are shown in wheat of 63,007 bushels and rye 183,885 bushels while barley indicates a decrease of 128,259 bushels.

DULUTH - The bonded Grain received during the week ending July 6th, 1923 was as follows:- wheat 52,691 bushels; oats 6,511 bushels and barley 12,430 bushels. The shipments were 38,979 bushels of wheat. The total receipts from September 1st, 1922 to July 6th, 1923, were as follows:- wheat 2,060,499 bushels; oats 281,157 bus; barley 160,157 bushels; flax 153,595 bushels and rye 120,284 bushels making a total of 2,784,692 bushels by rail and 38,385 bushels of flax by vessel. The shipments were as follows:- wheat 2,030,086 bushels; oats 166,834 bushels; barley 101,560 bus; and rye 147,135 bushels making a total of 2,445,615 bushels.


