CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 27th, 1923.

According to returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 27th, 1923 the quantity of grain in store showed a net decrease of 3,937,034 bushels. Rye showed an increase of 574,668 bushels, while wheat, oats, barley and flax showed decreases of 3,230,980 bushels; 1,105,044 bushels; 149,105 bushels and 26,573 bushels respectively.

IN THE WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS a total decrease is shown in all grains of 1,714,432 made up as follows:- Wheat 907,635 bushels; oats 560,041 bushels; barley 112,584 bushels; flax 34,459 bushels; rye 99,733 bushels. For details of the movement of grain by provinces see page 9 of the attached. THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Saskatoon, Moose Jaw and Calgary) stocks show a decrease in all grains of 113,147 bushels: wheat accounted for 75,302 bushels, oats 36,061 bushels and barley 1,734 bushels.

IN THE VANCOUVER GOVERNMENT TERMINAL ELEVATOR wheat showed a decrease of 101,282 bushels and oats 56 bushels. A total of 101,340 bushels.

THE PUBLIC & PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Ft. William & Pt. Arthur) A net decrease took place in all grains of 2,699,539 bushels: wheat showed a decrease of 2,250,583 bushels, oats 974,504 bushels, barley 266,970 bushels and rye 215,368 bushels. A small increase is indicated in Flax of 7,886 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS - the stocks almost remain the same as the previous week. The exception being in wheat which shows a decrease of only 120 bushels and rye an increase of 3,403 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST - A net decrease is shown in all grains of 450.613 bushels. Decreases took place in wheat of 302.498 bushels and oats 602.086 bushels, while Increases were indicated in Barley of 219.077 bushels and Rye 234.894 bushels.

THE TOTAL RECEIPTS OF WHEAT AT THE ABOVE ELEVATORS were 3,322.742 bushels by Vessel and 368.102 bushels by rail. The bulk of the former were received at the St. Lawrence ports by Vessel viz. 1,202.971 and 368.012 by rail - lower lake ports receipts amounted to 1,062.826 bushels by vessel, while Georgian Bay shows 1,056.945 bushels. The total grain receipts amounted to 1,384.933 to Georgian Bay Ports: 1,160.800 to lower lake ports; while St. Lawrence ports show 1,745.436 by vessel and 373.698 by rail. For details of the movement see page 7 of the grain statistics attached.

THE QUANTITY OF U.S. GRAIN IN STORE AT THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST was 3,342.252 bushels compared with 5,356.522 bushels for the same week last year. The bulk of the former being wheat and rye which were 2,664.740 and 1,516.772 bushels respectively, while the latter was corn 3,103.321 bushels and wheat 1,104.821 bushels. See page 8 of the attached grain statistics.

IN THE UNITED STATES LAKE PORTS increases took place in all grains of 320.144 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 252.455 bushels, oats 54.122 and Barley 13.567 bushels.

UNITED STATES ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS stocks show an increase of 154.985 bushels in wheat, oats 13.583 bushels, rye 651.472 bushels, while a small decrease is indicated in Barley of 1,431 bushels. The net increase over previous week was 818.609 bushels.
