Lake Shipping - 1954 Season

Final loading reports for the 1954 season of navigation on the Great Lakes have now been received and show total shipments from Fort William-Port Arthur to be the lightest since 1950. The heaviest season on record was that of 1945 when 483.7 million bushels were moved down from the Lakehead by vessel. The lightest in the last 20 years was 1937 when the total vessel movement amounted to only 113.4 million bushels of the five principal grains.
