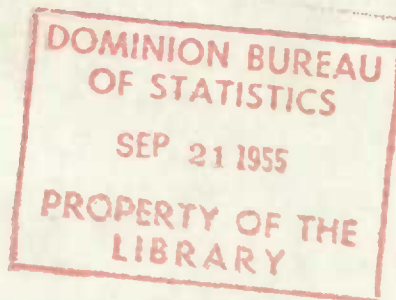

Preliminary Revisions, 1954-55 Marketings and Year-End Visible Stocks

Western country elevator companies have now completed filing with the Board of Grain Commissioners their preliminary adjustment reports on 1954-55 marketings. These returns have included both grain marketed during the closing week of July, 1955, for which reports were not available when their July 31 returns were compiled and grain marketed after July 31 but on 1954-55 quotes held open at various points in Western Canada. The stock and handling statistics summarized below are still subject to revision, basis crop year returns which will be filed at a later date.
