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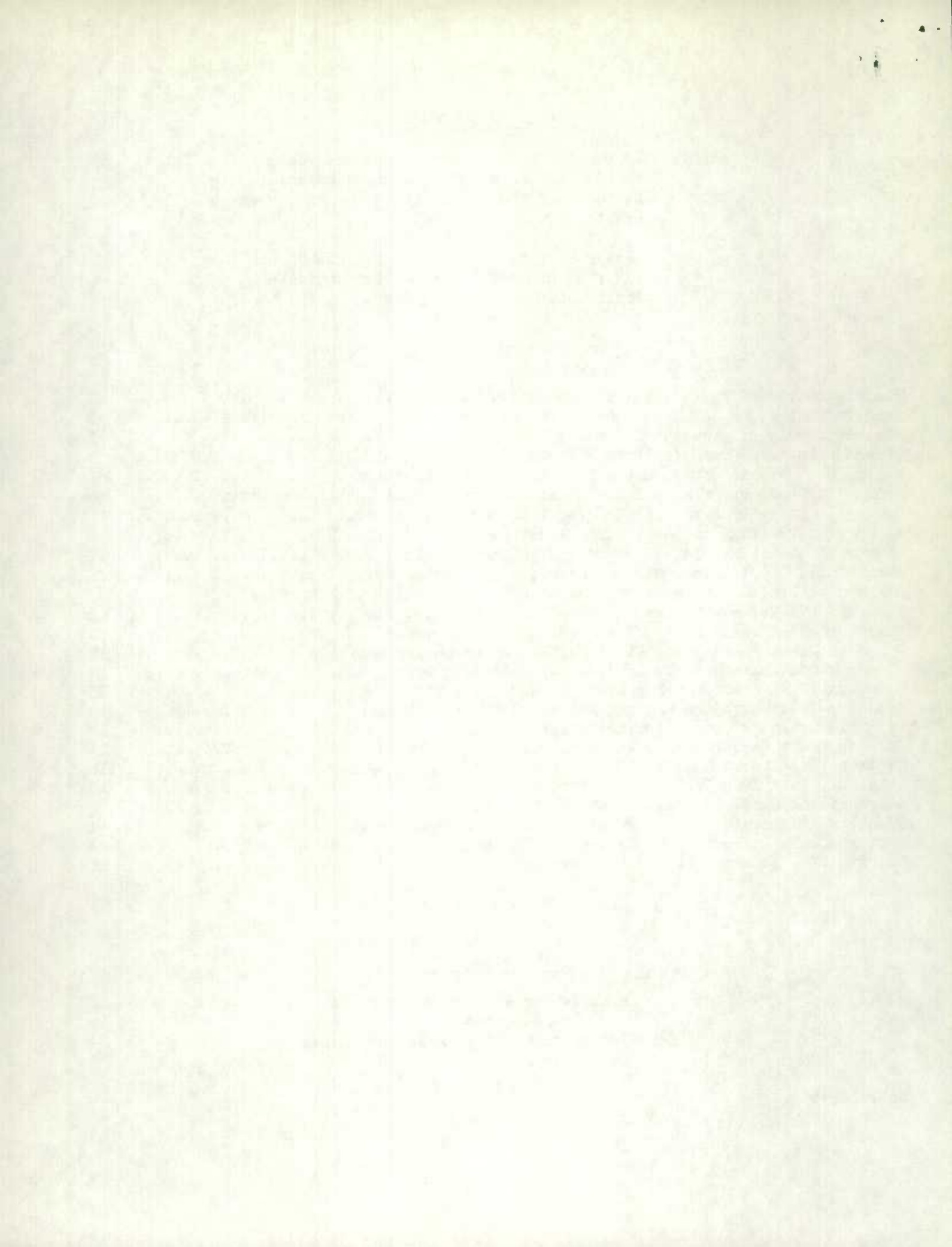

Summary of Preliminary Revised Country Elevator Stocks and  
Handlings, and Western Marketings Crop Year 1955-56.

According to the Board of Grain Commissioners country elevator companies have now completed filing their preliminary adjustment reports on 1955-56 operations. These returns covered those receipts and shipments which took place during the closing days of the 1955-56 Crop Year but which could not be included in the regular weekly return for the period ending July 31 by virtue either of the delay in mails or of the actual physical volume of clerical work involved. The additional receipts and shipments through country elevators reported in these adjustment returns have proven to be rather substantial and it is felt desirable to publish these preliminary adjustments in order to revise the figures carried in previous issues of this publication. The statistics which appear in the table below are still subject to revision basis the final Crop Year returns which will be filed by the companies next month.
