It will be noted that the input, output and stock figures do not give an exact accounting balance. While the major portion of the marketings were handled through regular country elevator channels, an estimated 135 thousand bushels were loaded by local dealers over loading platforms. On this portion and on certain lots of the country and mill movement it was not possible to determine the exact net amounts. In other instances subsequent cleaning operations altered the original assessment of dockages. This inbalance, however, represents only approximately 1 per cent of handlings and the above statistics are therefore presented as an indication of the crop year movement.
