CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING September 7th, 1923.

Returns received by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending September 7th, 1923 show total stocks of Canadian Grain in Store as follows:- Wheat 5,696,117 bus., Oats 3,811,629 bus., Barley 1,880,976 bus., Flax 183,960 bus., Rye 2,601,487 bus., and Corn 6,000 bushels, a total of 14,185,169 bushels for all grain. Oat stocks showed a decrease of 97,059 bushels from last week while other grains show increases as follows: Wheat 293,210 bus., Barley 136,122 bus., Flax 19 bus., Rye 46,099 bus., Corn 6,000 bus., a net increase of 384,391 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS show a net increase of 182,093 bushels in all grains. Increases took place in Wheat of 227,382 bushels, Barley 73,884 bushels, Flax 804 bushels, Rye 32,146 bushels. Oats show a single decrease of 152,118 bushels.

Receipts and Shipments at the above elevators show a substantial increases over the previous week's offerings.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in Store in Country Elevators in each of the ^{Prairie} Provinces and in Western Ontario and British Columbia on Aug. 31, 1923.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY) stocks show a net decrease of 56,302 bushels, Oats showing 57,405 and Rye 1,535 bushels, while an increase was shown in Wheat of 2,668 bushels.

IN THE VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS ELEVATOR Wheat in Store showed a decrease of 15,538 bushels, Oats remained the same as previous week,

IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & FT. ARTHUR) the reverse took place from the previous week instead of a decrease of 909,333 bushels a net increase is shown of 858,489 bushels, Wheat showing 410,476 bushels; Oats 53,491 bus and Barley 237,375 bushels and Rye 147,934 bushels while Flax showed 785 bushels decrease.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS the stocks show increases in Wheat and Oats of 1,044 and 6,652 bushels respectively, a decrease was indicated in Rye of 21,346 bushels, making a net decrease of 13,650 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST the total Grain in Store show a net decrease of 517,948 bushels. The decreases took place in wheat of 302,978 bushels; Barley 204,018 bushels; Rye 113,354 bushels; while an increase is shown in Oats of 102,402 bushels.

THE TOTAL RECEIPTS OF WHEAT at these elevators were 926,978 bushels by Vessel and 2,134 bushels by rail. Lower Lake Ports account for 413,355 of this and St. Lawrence Ports 366,357 bushels by Vessel. The Rail receipt of 2,134 bushels is shown at the latter ports. Georgian Bay Ports show only 147,299 bushels by Vessel. The Total Receipts for all grains amounted to 1,855,790 bushels by Vessel and 6,570 bushels by Rail. The bulk of this was received at St. Lawrence Ports amounting to 1,171,944 bushels by Vessel and 6,570 bushels by Rail. Lower Lake Ports show 497,930 bushels while Georgian Bay Ports show 185,916 bushels by Vessel. For detailed statement of Receipts and Shipments see page 7 of the attached.

THE QUANTITY OF UNITED STATES GRAIN IN STORE AT THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST was 4,900,816 bushels as compared with 6,419,550 at the same date last year. The following table shows quantities of each of the different grains comprised in these totals:

AT THE U.S. LAKE PORTS, all grain showed an increase of 119,638 bushels in Store over the previous week with the exception of Oats which showed a decrease of 54,000 bushels. The increases were as follows: Wheat 138,576 bushels; Barley 58,324 bushels; Rye 12,738 bushels.

UNITED STATES ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS decreases were shown in all grains of 172,336 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 132,360 bushels; Oats 6,049 bushels; Barley 29,443 bushels and Rye 10,484 bushels. Canadian Corn shows 6,000 bushels in Store.


