CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING November 9th, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended November 9th, 1923 show a net increase in the stocks of 11,519,328 bushels. The amounts in store for the week were as follows:- Wheat 89,091,674 bushels; Oats 12,523,769 bushels; Barley 4,105,190 bushels; Flax 1,879,483 bushels; Rye 4,149,537 bushels, a total of 111,749,653 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat, Oats, and Flax of 9,674,185 bushels; 2,161,956 bushels; and 104,753 bushels respectively, while decreases were shown in Barley of 314,145 bushels and 107,426 bushels in Rye.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Increases are shown in all grains in store over the previous week of 5,841,359 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,667,873 bushels; Oats 892,939 bushels; Barley 170,528 bushels; Flax 49,683 bushels; Rye 60,336 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on November 2, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). A net increase is shown in all grains of 23,519 bushels. The increases took place in Oats, Barley, Flax and Rye of 16,620, 9,119, 1,038 and 7,136 bushels respectively, while a decrease is shown in Wheat of 10,394 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The stocks in store show an increase of 94,335 bushels in all grains. Wheat shows 37,576 bushels and Rye 6,759 bushels increase which makes up the total.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 44,842 bushels. The increases were Wheat 418,130 and Oats 461,286 bushels, while decreases took place in Barley of 302,458 bushels, Flax 25,940 bushels and Rye 106,176 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in Wheat of 23,137 bushels while decreases were noted in Oats of 20,076 bushels and Barley 1,474 bushels making a net increase of 6,587 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store showed a net increase of 2,167,149 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 1,952,409 bushels; Oats 199,444 bushels and Flax 79,956 bushels while decreases were shown in Barley of 42,558 bushels and Rye 22,102 bushels.

The total quantity of Wheat received was 8,231,005 bushels by Vessel and 2,715,784 bushels by Rail. Georgian Bay and Lower Lake Ports accounted for 3,849,604 bushels and 2,471,671 bushels ^{by Vessel} while a small amount of 5,650 bushels was received by Rail. St. Lawrence Ports received 1,909,670 bushels by Vessel and 2,669,263 bushels by Rail. Canadian Seaboard Ports received a small amount of 40,781 bushels by Rail.

THE TOTAL GRAIN received at the above elevators amounted to 9,342,680 bushels by Vessel and 2,931,936 bushels by Rail. The bulk of this was received at Georgian Bay Ports and amounted to 4,618,478 bushels, Lower Lake Ports was next with 2,546,818 bushels while St. Lawrence Ports accounted for 2,177,384 bushels all by Vessel. The Rail receipts show a small amount of 5,650 bushels at Lower Lake Ports; St. Lawrence Ports 2,885,465 bushels while for the first time Seaboard Ports show a receipt of 40,871 bushels.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE WEST. The amount in store was 4,131,808 bushels compared with 6,391,824 bushels last year, a decrease of 2,260,016 bushels. Of the former amount 3,286,110 bushels were in store at St. Lawrence Ports while Georgian Bay Ports show 845,698 bushels. Last year for the same week Georgian Bay had 3,444,522 bushels in store and St. Lawrence Ports 2,939,182 bushels. For detail of the movement of U.S. Grain see page 8 of the attached grain statistics. U.S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase took place in all grains of 1,483,010 bushels. The increases were in Wheat of 1,314,996 bushels; Oats 201,015 bushels; Barley 4,495 bushels and Flax 21 bushels, while decrease is shown of 37,517 bushels in Rye.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Increases are shown in Wheat and Oats of 1,215,458 bushels and 410,728 bushels respectively while Barley shows a decrease of 151,797 bushels and Rye 15,862 bushels making a net increase of 1,458,527 bushels in all grains.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded grain for the week by Lake amounted to 523,293 bus; Barley 4,145 bushels and Flaxseed 21 bushels. The Shipments by Lake were Barley 53,232 bushels and Rye 37,220 bushels while the Rail Shipments were wheat 2,509 bushels; Oats 901 bushels and Rye 297 bushels. Wheat Receipts Rail 44,437 bushels.

The Receipts for the period from Sept. 1st to November 9th, were as follows:- Wheat 1,031,552 bushels; Barley 168,959 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 86,503 bushels; Flaxseed 21 bushels a total of 1,349,954 bushels, while the Shipments were Wheat 142,537 bushels; Barley 165,889 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 37,072 bushels, a total of 429,015 bushels
