CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 16TH, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended November 16th, 1923, shows an increase of 12,704,734 bushels in the stocks. The amount in store for the week was Wheat 98,953,481; Oats 14,663,098 bushels; Barley 4,488,480 bushels; Flax 2,148,130 bushels; Rye 4,201,198 bushels; a total of 124,454,587 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 9,361,507 bushels; Oats 2,139,329 bushels; Barley 383,290 bushels; Flax 268,647 bushels and Rye 51,661 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Increases continued to take place in all grains of 7,950,255 bushels over the previous week, make up as follows:-Wheat 3,773,455 bushels; Oats 839,762 bushels; Barley 142,300 bushels; Flax 80,879 bushels; Rye 64,642 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on November 9, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also the same period last year.


INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). A net increase is shown in all grains of 29,666 bushels. A decrease took place in Wheat of 17,885 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 26,153 bushels; Barley 52 bushels; Flax 71 bushels and Rye 19,275 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A net increase is shown in all grains of 13,749 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 12,161 bushels and Rye 1,680 bushels. A small decrease is shown in Oats of 92 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks show a net increase of 560,115 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 637,532 bushels; Barley 87,535 bushels; and Rye 57,865 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 1,156,620 bushels and Flax 136,477 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 11,093 bushels. An increase took place in Wheat of 2,617 bushels while Oats decreased 13,710 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. Canadian Grain. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 2,537,378 bushels. These were made up as follows: Wheat 2,033,925 bushels; Oats 214,626 bushels; Barley 297,107 bushels; Flax 2,020 bushels; a single decrease is noted in Rye of 10,000 bushels.

7284,548 bushels and 1,417,950 bushels of Wheat were received by Vessel and Rail respectively at the above elevators for the past week. The Vessel Receipts were as follows:- Georgian Bay Ports 3,755,540 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,881,056 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,047,952 bushels. The Rail Receipts amounted to 2,402 bushels at Lower Lake Ports; 1,209,783 at St. Lawrence Ports while the Canadian Seaboard showed 205,765 bushels.

The total grain Receipts amounted to 8,570,673 bushels and 1,983,993 bushels by Water and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay received 4,423,049 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports was next with 2,548,775 bushels while Lower Lake Ports showed 1,798,849 bushels. The Rail Receipts amounted to St. Lawrence Ports 1,785,426 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 2,402 bushels and Canadian Seaboard Ports 205,765 bushels.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The amount in store was 3,631,870 bushels compared with 6,050,797 bushels, a decrease of 2,418,927 bushels. Of the former amount 1,115,718 bushels were in store at Georgian Bay Ports while in the St. Lawrence Ports there were 2,516,152 bushels. Last year the amount in store at the Georgian Bay Ports was 3,474,118 bushels and 2,573,032 bushels in the St. Lawrence Ports. U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 2,842,592 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 2,895,303 bushels and Rye 1,551 bushels. Decreases took place in Oats of 8,550 bushels and Barley 45,717 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEAPORT PORTS. Increases took place in Wheat of 1,799,758 bushels; Barley 77,113 bushels and Rye 32,576 bushels while a single decrease is shown in Oats of 127,480 bushels.

GRINNELL. The Receipts of Bonded Grain by Vessel for the week ended November 16, 1923, amounted to Wheat 326,905 bushels. The shipments were by Rail amounting to Wheat 31,149 bushels; Oats 11,678 bushels; and Barley 11,595 bushels a total of 36,420 bushels. The Receipts for the period from September 1st to November 16th, 1923, were as follows:- Wheat 1,358,460 bushels; Barley 163,959 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 36,505 bushels; Flaxseed 21 bushels; a total of 1,676,859 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 205,686 bushels; Barley 177,482 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 18,750 bushels; a total of 515,435 bushels.

MOVEMENT OF UNITED STATES GRAIN THROUGH CANADA, CROP YEAR 1922-23.

The movement of United States grain through Canada during the crop year September 1, 1922 to August 31, 1923, shows total handleings of United States grain in Canadian Public Elevators in the East of 118,950,584 bushels. It must be remembered that a large part of this grain was handled twice, first on its entry at the lake ports and secondly when finally shipped out, and as a result appears twice in the record. The grain finally re-exported from Canadian ports of exit amounted to 55,513,235 bushels.

The harvests are earlier in the United States than in Canada, and the movement of this grain is well under way before the peak is reached in the handling of Canadian grain. The largest amounts of United States grain received by water come in during the months of August, September and October. The rail movement to the St. Lawrence and Seaboard ports is practically continuous throughout the year.

It has been impossible to show the destination of shipments of individual points. These have, therefore, been grouped under the following headings - "Canadian Seaboard", "Other Canadian Points", "United States Seaboard", and "Other United States Points."

GEORGIAN BAY PORTS.

The total amount of United States grain received at the above ports during the crop year 1922-23 amounted to 38,818,915 bushels which with the carry-over from the previous year of 1,712,453 bushels makes a total of 40,531,208 bushels handled at these ports. The amount received by each individual Georgian Bay port was as follows:

The shipments of this grain from these ports were by rail and amounted to 39,636,890 bushels. The largest quantity was forwarded to Montreal, the amount being 24,194,380 bushels. The destinations of the balance were as follows:

THE LOWER LAKE POOL.

The amount received at Port Colborne was 16,165,330 bushels all coming in by vessel. This with the small amount on hand, 180,900 bushels, makes up the total quantity of United States grain handled at this point, 16,346,730 bushels. The shipments were practically all by water, amounting to 16,191,921 bushels destined to Montreal. A small quantity of 38,075 bushels was forwarded by rail to the same destination.

ST. LAWRENCE PORTS POOL.

According to the returns from the elevators at Montreal, the amount of United States grain received was 25,128,467 bushels by vessel and 29,254,252 bushels by rail. These amounts together with the carry-over from the previous year of 3,771,984 bushels make the total amount for disposition of 58,154,703 bushels. It will be noted that the total receipts at Montreal do not agree with the water shipments from Port Colborne or the rail shipments from Georgian Bay Ports by 8,936,546 and 5,059,872 bushels respectively. This is accounted for by direct shipments from United States ports to Montreal.

The largest movement of this grain out of Montreal is by vessel to the United Kingdom and other overseas countries, the amount being 52,378,774 bushels which joined with 351,581 bushels from Quebec make a total re-export via St. Lawrence Ports of 52,730,355 bushels.

An analysis of the rail shipments from Montreal shows that the small quantity of 552,331 bushels went to the United States Seaboard. 468,145 bushels moved to other Canadian Points and 66,866 bushels to the Canadian Seaboard. An amount of 686,553 bushels was shipped out of the elevators for local consumption.

The elevator situated in the city of Quebec received 364,304 bushels by rail and 791,684 bushels by water. This with the carry-over of 165,577 bushels makes a total of 1,321,565 bushels handled. 351,581 bushels were shipped out by water as above, rail shipments to other Canadian Points amounted to 248,593 bushels and 215,862 bushels were consumed locally.

CANADIAN SEABOARD.

The total receipts at St. John, N.B., which was the only Canadian Seaboard Port handling United States grain, amounted to 2,586,578 bushels. The amounts shipped from Georgian Bay Ports and Montreal to the Canadian Seaboard were shown as 4,827,364, bushels. This exceeds the receipts at St. John by 2,240,786 bushels. No doubt some of the grain designated "Canadian Seaboard" should have been "Other Canadian Points". The shipments amounted to 2,582,880 bushels to United Kingdom and other Overseas Countries. This amount added to 52,730,355 bushels re-exported from St. Lawrence Ports makes a total overseas movement of 55,513,235 bushels.
